NO TRIAL BY JURY.

Supreme Court Sustains the Uncon-  
stitutionality of the Constitution.

Washington, June 1.—The legality  
of the oleomargarine law was affirmed  
by the supreme court today.

In the case of Dorr and O'Brien,  
editors of a Manila newspaper, con-  
victed of libel in the Philippines, af-  
ter having demanded a jury trial,  
which was denied them, the court de-  
claring against appellants. The deci-  
sion called attention to the fact that  
the government of the Philippines  
had been expressly left by the treaty  
of Paris in the hands of congress, and  
congress, because of the incapacity of  
the people of the island, had purpose-  
ly withheld the right of trial by jury.  
Peckham, Harlan, Fuller and Brewer  
dissented.
