## A FAVORABLE WEEK

ASIDE FROM SLIGHT FROSTS  
 CROPS ARE DOING WELL.

Stock in Excellent Condition—Fall Wheat, Barley and Rye Heading Out Nicely—Strawberries Are Ripe and on the Markets—Prune Crop Will Be Light—Other Fruit Crops Will Be Heavy.

The past week has not been altogether favorable for the growing crops; the days were warmer than usual, but the nights were cool and several frosts occurred, but the damage done by them was slight and confined principally to tender vegetables, such as beans, tomatoes, etc.

Some fruit, however, was killed in the Grande Ronde valley and a few other localities east of the Cascade mountains. The rains early Tuesday morning occurred after the following reports were made. They were not only timely, but well distributed, and give promise of continuing for another day or two, in which case they will be sufficient for all needs and greatly stimulate the growth of late crops.

Late wheat is coming up to poor stands, and corn, potatoes and gardens are growing slowly. Forage crops, except timothy, are doing well, and the first crop of alfalfa is being harvested with satisfactory yields. Stock everywhere is in excellent condition.

Fall wheat, barley and rye are heading nicely, and these crops are generally in a very promising condition, notwithstanding that some low land wheat in Umatilla county was badly damaged by freezing weather earlier in the season. Hops are growing nicely and the hop men have now caught up with their work so that the yards generally are well cultivated.

Strawberries are ripe, and home grown berries will be plentiful in the markets during the week. Apples have set well. Prunes will be light, but peaches, pears and cherries are turning out better than expected earlier in the season.

### Columbia River Valley.

Moster, Wasco county, J. M. Carroll—Weather warm; all crops doing nicely; cherries fell off badly; grain, pasturage and gardens good; lambing all done.

Wasco, Sherman county, W. C. Morehouse—Volunteer and fall wheat beginning to head; all crops growing rapidly.

Condon, Gilliam county, F. B. Stevens—Fine growing weather; grass has made a better growth than for years; grain growing finely; light frost Monday and Tuesday nights did not hurt fruit; sheep are now going to their summer ranges in the mountains.

Lexington, Morrow county, E. R. Beach—Frost cut down many of the more advanced potatoes; since then weather warm and growth rapid; the prune crop will be almost nothing; so far as fruit has existed it is doing well; summer fallowing about completed; grain will soon be matured, and an average crop is expected.

Athena, Umatilla county, L. A. Githens—Fall wheat looking well; good growth and stand; spring wheat good stand mostly, but needing rain; looking very well, though; Wednesday night's frost damaged wheat and gardens to considerable extent in low localities; a few days of summer fallowing yet to do, and ground now very hard and cloddy.

### WOMEN OF ALL NATIONS MEET.

An Indiana Woman Will Preside, and America Will Be Liberally Represented—All Matters of Public Concern to Be Discussed, Besides Many Questions of General Interest to Everybody.

Berlin, June 2.—American women are to have a prominent part in the quinquennial meeting of the International Council of Women, to be held in Berlin next week and the week following. In addition to Mrs. May Wright Sewall of Indiana, who will preside over the sessions, there will be present a delegation of nearly two-score representative women of the United States and Canada.

The first week of the gathering is to be devoted to executive sessions of the council proper which will occupy the mornings. Three public meetings will be held in the evenings on the general subject of "The New Internationalism," its object being both a demonstration and a propaganda. As a part of this plan reports of the 19 national councils will be given. The special subject of the third evening, peace and arbitration, will be discussed in three formal addresses by Lady Aberdeen in English, by Baroness von Suttner in German, and by a French speaker in her own language.

The second week will be given over to the popular gathering. It will be divided into four sections for discussions under the heads of Women's education and higher culture, women in social aims and institutions, women's professions and industries, and the legal and political position of women.
