NEW YORK FASHIONS

New York, June 4.—A woman would rather give up her vacation did she not have an appropriate outfit and plenty of nice things to wear. In the case of wealthy women the solution of the vacation outfit problem is simple enough. They simply get what they want or think they will want and that ends it. With women who are less endowed with worldly riches the problem is not so simple.

Fortunately this year fashion has come to the rescue of the working or business women, and with a little taste and ingenuity they can fit themselves out neatly and becomingly without cutting too deep into their bank accounts. Shirt waist suits of linen, canvas or mercerized cotton are their saving. They cost comparatively little, look always neat and trim and wear incredibly long without losing their freshness. There are two ways of accomplishing the same end.

One is by making up a shirt waist suit, skirt and shirt waist of the same material, or by making skirt and jacket of the same material, and wear separate waists of different materials with them. These linen suits are a great blessing to women who wish to look neat and cannot afford to spend much money for clothes. The thinner grades of linen and cotton are more suitable for the purpose and give better effects if made up into shirt waist suits.

Two of those suits, with two or three extra shirt waists are about all that a working woman requires for her vacation outfit. The basis for the suits lends itself to any amount of elaboration, according to the taste and the means of the owner. If hand embroidery is used to a considerable extent in trimming and ornamenting the suits, their cost may be brought up to quite a high figure. But the wise woman will not be too extravagant in trimming her skirts.

The array of new summer silks offered this year includes Bengal and Tokio cloths and Messaline. Dotted and flowered foulards are also quite popular, particularly the former. Many of the foulards have small and stiff conventional designs. They come in various colors, principally in blues, browns, heliotropes and greens, spotted with white. On the other hand the designs on the modern organdies, mousselines, grenadines and other thin fabrics show mostly large and blurred flower designs. The color combinations are unusually pleasing this year.

Wide girdles are the proper thing just now and although they are not becoming to every woman, they are extremely popular among slender women. These girdles are not only very becoming to slender and average-sized women, but they are also more comfortable than any girdle that has been in vogue for many years. Colored belts are much worn and are offered in a great variety of shades in the shops. Pale green and burnt orange look well on black frocks, while white frocks permit almost any color of girdle.

Artificial flowers and fruits are an important feature of hat trimmings this year. Some remarkably fine specimens are shown in the shops. There is a rather peculiar fact noticeable in the displays shown this year. Although there are some flowers which are almost perfect imitations of nature in form and color, there are others which show the natural form, are colored as nature's products are never colored. Green, blue and brown roses and cherries of the most fantastic coloring are by no means rare. The faded or frost-bitten roses, which were first introduced earlier in the season, seem to meet with general approval and the demand for them is so great that the manufacturers can scarcely turn out enough to supply the demand. In trimming hats more attention is paid to pleasing and artistic color schemes this year than ever before. There are some remarkably beautiful combinations of colors seen on some of the hats and in some cases the effects produced are quite original.
