**Local Option Carries.**  
Portland, June 7.—Incomplete returns for the entire state up till noon indicate that the republicans carried nearly everything, including Congressman Binger Hermann, although by not as large a majority as expected. Local option amendment in the state has also carried.

**La Grande Gets County Seat.**  
La Grande, June 7.—The vote on county seat is 72 per cent in favor of La Grande. County tickets mixed. Local option carried in the county.

**Hermann Slides In.**  
Portland, June 7.—While the republican majority of the first district is from 7,500 to 9,500, the unofficial count gives Hermann but 3,000 plurality.


**Local Option Wins by 4,000.**  
Portland, June 7.—With 10 counties yet to hear from, not including Multnomah, the majority in favor of local option is 4,000 in round numbers. These returns are official as far as they go, but in no county do they include a full vote, some of the back county precincts are still to be heard from in all counties and as these are usually local option in principle, the indications are that the majority in favor of local option will be large.

**CONTRACT LET.**  
**Gibson Will Build Second Story to Peoples Warehouse.**  
The contract has been let for the construction of the second story to the building now occupied by the Peoples Warehouse. Arthur Gibson was awarded the contract, and the addition will cost about \$6,000 or \$7,000.

Tomorrow morning workmen will commence the erection of the scaffolding around the front of the building and work will be started as soon as the material can be brought to the ground. It is estimated that it will take about a month to complete the building. The front will be constructed of pressed brick and will be one of the most artistic in the city when completed.
