LAND FOR SETTLERS

HOMES FOR 60,000 TO BE OPENED UP SOON.

United States Government Plans to Dispose of Indian Lands at Different Points—Rosebud, Devil's Lake and Grande Ronde Indians Will Each Contribute to the Demand for More Homes.

Washington, June 10.—Homes for 11,800 families, or 58,000 individuals, will be offered by the government within the next few weeks.

Some of these will be sold to the highest bidder, but most of them can be obtained at \$4 an acre or less.

Almost 2,000,000 acres of land are involved, 256,000 acres being in Minnesota, on the Red Lake reservation, 382,000 acres in South Dakota, on the Rosebud reservation, 88,000 in North Dakota, on the Devil's Lake reservation, 115,000 acres in Montana, on the Crow reservation, and 27,000 acres in Oregon, on the Grande Ronde reservation.

In opening these reservations a new plan has been adopted. Heretofore the government first has purchased reservation lands from the Indians and then offered them to the public.

Now, however, the ownership of the lands will remain with the Indians. The government will conduct and direct the sales and the proceeds will be turned into the treasury to the credit of the representative tribes to be disbursed to them in small annuities, so it will do them the most good.

The lands soon to be sold embrace valuable agricultural and timber tracts and may be had by the homesteaders for a small fraction of their real value. Congress, profiting by experience, wisely has placed a limit of \$4 an acre on the land in two of the reservations to protect the Indians from imposition, such as the government itself has suffered under the old land laws.

The land in the Red Lake reservation will be sold at public auction to the highest bidder, the sale to commence June 29. No bid of less than \$4 an acre can be considered. A lottery will be conducted to dispose of the lands in the Rosebud reservation. Persons desiring to locate a home there will be required to make application to the registrar at designated land offices. They will be given certificates, each bearing separate numbers.

Registration begins July 5 and closes July 23. Cards bearing numbers corresponding with the different registration certificates issued will be placed in a lottery wheel and the applicants will be allowed to select their land in the order of drawing. The lottery plan of determining the order of selection was tried with

much success when the government lands in Oklahoma were thrown open to settlement.

The Rosebud land must by law be sold at the uniform price of \$4 an acre for a certain time, after which all unsold land may be disposed of at \$3 an acre. The purchaser must make a cash payment of \$1 an acre, and pay yearly installments of 75 cents per acre until the land is paid for.

After a survey of the Crow reservation is completed, the lands there will be sold under the lottery plan. The survey work may require several months. The Devil's Lake reservation lands also will be sold by lottery.

When the lands in Oregon on the Grande Ronde reservation are sold, a different method will be followed. There the lands will go to the highest bidders, congress stipulating that no bid of less than \$1 an acre shall be accepted.

In disposing of these Indian lands the tribes are well cared for. The Indians are not to be driven off nor deprived of their homes. The lands to be sold represent really the surplus, and are offered by the government only after the Indians have been given an allotment.
