

Details of the Drill. Each trooper fires five shots at the

BINGHAM SPRINGS. 200 yard line and the same number at the 300, 400, 500 and 600 yard line. In addition to this they have, daily a skirmish drill, Figures simulating soldiers in kneeling, stooping and lying position are placed in front of the butts. These figures are frames

of iron covered with canvas. The trooper begins firing at the 600 yard line and after firing three shots. runs to the 500 line, where he fires several more shots and continues to advance, firing at each 100 yard line till he has arrived at the 200 yard line, where he fires five shots.

In all he fires 20 shots and his rec-ord is kept. The 20 shots must be fired in a certain time or they are not counted on his record.




