### ATHENA WILL CELEBRATE.

Two Days' Celebration Will Be Given at the Wheat Town.

Athena, June 15.—At a meeting of the citizens yesterday afternoon it was decided to hold a two days' celebration, on July 4 and 5, and committees on arrangement were appointed.

Both days will be devoted to patriotic programs, and one of the finest displays of fireworks ever seen in Athena will be given on the evening of July 5.

A general committee, consisting of A. M. Gillis, chairman, William Mosgrove, Ed Manasse, Dr. A. W. Botkin, Sam Booher and Dr. J. D. Plamondon, was appointed, with assignments as follows: Mosgrove, grounds and parade; Johnson, music; Botkin, program and speakers; Plamondon, sports and amusements; Booher, fireworks, and Manasse, finance.

H. A. Barrett will be marshal of the day.

The citizens of Athena extend a cordial invitation to the people of Umatilla county to attend the celebration, and as there is to be no other celebration in this portion of the county, a large attendance is assured.

### PATRONS' MASS MEETING.

West End People in Relation to School Building Site.

Some of the residents of the west end held a meeting last evening, at which time the location of a school site for that part of town was pretty thoroughly discussed, and it was decided to appoint a couple of men to make a canvass of the west end and find the sentiment of the school patrons and taxpayers in regard to the location.

H. L. Hasbrouck and J. F. Carrier were appointed, and will today make a canvass of the district with a couple of petitions, one asking the board to locate on the baseball park site, and the other praying for the purchase of the old poor farm property. Mr. Hasbrouck will circulate the baseball park petition, and Mr. Carrier the one favoring the location of the old farm property.

The board will at its next meeting look over the two petitions, and be guided to a great extent in their financial decision by the evident intention of the signers.

Owing to the absence of C. J. Smith and of W. M. Pierce, it is not likely that another meeting of the board will be held much before the last of the present week, or the first of the next. When that meeting is held, however, a final selection of sites will in all probability be made.

### FRUIT ON THE MOUNTAINS.

George Peebler, of Meacham, Has Fine Prospects for a Crop at an Elevation of 3600 Feet.

George Peebler, who resides about seven miles west of Meacham on the high plateau lying near the summit of the Blue mountains, has an excellent fruit prospect this year. His farm is located at an elevation of about 3600 feet above sea level and yet his peaches, plums, cherries, apples and apricots will all bear very good yields without damage from frost.

He has 200 acres in cultivation, most of this being seeded to timothy and grain hay, and his hay crop is better than for a number of years. Timothy is a native product of high elevations, all the flats in the Blue mountains having been seeded by campers, bear luxuriant growths of this hay without cultivation or irrigation.

Captain Hanna, a neighbor of Mr. Peebler, has about a quarter of an acre of strawberries which yields a highly flavored berry, in large quantities. The mountains are dotted with productive farms at that elevation.

### CHARITIES AND CORRECTION.

Hundreds of Delegates From United States and Canada at Portland.

Portland, Me., June 15.—Hundreds of delegates representing all parts of the United States and Canada have gathered in Portland for a week's conference to discuss the cause and remedies of pauperism and crime. The occasion is the twenty-fifth anniversary meeting of the National Conference of Charities and Correction.

The large attendance and the interesting program combine to give promise of the most notable meeting of the kind ever held in America. The gathering will be formally opened this evening with welcomes and responses. President Jeffrey R. Brackett of Baltimore, will preside. The regular program of papers and discussions will be taken up tomorrow.

### In Memory of War Heroes.

Nashville, Tenn., June 15.—The principal feature of this, the second day of the United Confederate Veterans' reunion, was the laying of the cornerstone for the magnificent Confederate monument to be erected in Centennial park. The event was attended by thousands of veterans representing every part of the south. The exercises were conducted under Masonic auspices with Grand Master Sloane presiding. The oration of the day was delivered by Senator E. W. Carmack.
