The provisions of the ordinance are so radical, however, that they will make it practically impossible to erect any more new theaters in the Broadway district.

Under the provisions of the ordinance so much space is required for alley room, that the erection of any building complying with the law, under the present real estate prices would be altogether out of the ques-tion. Among other things the new ordinance provides that all balconies and staircases must be of iron.
