HARNESS THE LAKE

MONSTER POWER PLANT BUILT NEAR LA GRANDE.

Mountain Reservoir 120 Acres in Extent and 12 Feet Deep Now Constructed—Cost of Dam \$130,000—Will Generate 1000 Horse Power at First to Be Increased to 10,000 Horse Power When Needed—Will Also Furnish 75,000,000 Gallons of Water Per Month to City of La Grande.

One of the most tremendous water power schemes in Eastern Oregon is now being constructed at Morgan Lake, three miles south of La Grande on the summit of the Blue mountains by the La Grande Water Storage Company.

From time immemorial Morgan lake, a shallow body of water about 100 acres in extent, has been the chief stock watering place of the entire Rock creek and Sheep creek stock range of La Grande. It is located on the very top of the spur of the mountains at an elevation of 4200 feet.

About a year ago S. R. Haworth, W. G. Hunter and J. W. Scriber conceived the idea of utilizing the power possibilities of this body of water. The lower end of the lake has an outlet toward the city of La Grande and a dam 300 feet long, 190 wide at the base, and 40 feet high is being constructed at a cost of \$130,000 to confine the water.

A lake 120 acres in extent and now averaging 12 feet deep has been formed, with a possibility of increasing the depth to 30 feet by building a few hundred feet of levee. Surveys have been made for 11,175 feet of pipe line leading to the La Grande city reservoir. Steel pipe two feet in diameter will be used to conduct the water down the mountain canyon to the power plant about one mile from the lake, where 1000 horse power will be developed at first, with the possibility of increasing the power to 10,000 horse power when needed.

Arrangements have been practically completed by which the storage company will furnish the city of La Grande 75,000,000 gallons per month for distribution through the city water mains.

The elevation of the lake above the city of La Grande is 1450 feet, in a distance of three miles, making the force of the water supply, if unrestrained, beyond computation.

To supply the lake with a perpetual flow of fresh water two mountain streams, Sheep creek and Rock creek are being diverted into it by means of six miles of pipe lines and flumes. The company has now 18 teams employed completing the immense dam and the work of laying the pipe line will begin at once.

A second smaller lake 25 acres in extent, lying on a bench just below the main lake, will be cleaned out and converted into a resort for boating and summer picnics. It is fringed all around with a growth of pine and can be fed from the overflow of the main lake.

When completed this will be the best water supply and source of power enjoyed by any Eastern Oregon city. As the demands of the city may require the depth of the lake may be increased from 12 to 30 feet by building levees on the brow of the hill forming the south bank of the lake. The headgate is 36 inches in diameter and the lake can be drained by opening the gate of the penstock. At present the depth is increasing about one inch per day and the Rock creek supply has not yet been turned in.

AMONG THE "BROOMTAILS."

Queer Breed of Little Horses in the American Desert.

Funny little horses are the "broomtails," scurrying over the plains where the four corners meet of Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona and Utah. The wit of any kind of a broncho is wonderful, but the tactics of the "broomtails" make them the wonder of the wild ranges and canyons.

A story is told about a "broomtail" who had a sickly colt, which she hid in the underbrush while she grazed under the rimrock. Suddenly a horse hunter dashed into the glade, and as Madame Broomtail could neither desert her baby nor yet carry it away, she at once conceived a bit of strategy, says the Detroit News-Tribune.

At the first alarm she gave a kind of snort, which plainly meant, "Keep still, little one," then she trotted about tamely, sniffing at the intruder until he made a dash at her, whereupon, instead of bounding away with head erect, an easy mark for a lasso she stopped short with her head between her knees and kicked earnestly and hard, as only a "broomtail" can. No expedient could make her life her head to a roping position, and she studiously avoided the spot where her colt was hid.

After a while the cowboy attempted to rope her by the feet, but she made a cunning pass with her heels and lamed his mount. She seemed to realize at once that even a sick "broomtail" might defy a lame pursuer, and neighed triumphantly at her baby. Together they disappeared in the timber, and the disappointed horse hunter walked to the nearest camp.

It is commonly understood that the "broomtails" are descended from American horses that escaped from the settlements; but the large number of pintos (spotted ponies) found in the herds would seem to indicate a strong infusion of Spanish (mustang) blood. Indeed, the Navajo Indians assert that wild horses have ranged the region of the breaks since the days of the men who built the high houses (cliff dwellers).

Germans in Argentina.
The emigration of Germans to South America, which has so disquieted Monroe doctrine doctors, is likely to be checked somewhat by the warning issued by the central information bureau of the German Colonial Company that German emigrants should not go to Argentina at the present time. It is next to an impossibility for a German clerk to find a position in a business house. Even independent merchants would find it difficult to get on there under present conditions. The cost of living in Buenos Ayres is double what it is in the large cities of Germany. Farming on a small scale does not pay. Today only men of experience and with a thorough knowledge of Spanish are engaged as overseers on the large farms and ranches. In tropical climates it is impossible for German farm hands and day laborers to compete with Italians, Spaniards and natives.
