Sprinkle Streets With Oil.

City Recorder Meader has placed an order with the Columbia Southern railway for three cars of crude petroleum with which to oil our streets. It is estimated that the oil can be laid down in Wasco for \$1.26 per barrel. Strawberry Market Glutted.

On account of the Eastern market being overstocked it has ceased to be profitable to ship strawberries from Hood River and growers are now sending their berries to the Davison Fruit Company for canning. The cannery has a capacity of 10,000 cans a day, and is receiving all the berries it can handle. Growers are paid from one to three cents a pound for their berries, according to quality.

TREATMENT OF MINERS BY THE MILITIA. Driven Away From the Train by the Miners Were Carried They Were Criminals—News- Correspondent Prodded With Gun When He Asked a Civil

stopped at La Junta to change engines. "About 100 citizens of all classes were lined up at the depot to watch the usual spectacle. No demonstration was made by the citizens and none intended.

"On arrival the militiamen and deputy sheriffs accompanying the special, hastily formed a patrol in front of the train, roughly ordering the crowd back, which order was promptly obeyed. Krag-Jorgensen was threateningly thrust through the car windows, while the patrol drew revolvers and flourished them.

"Col. C. L. Seeley, local correspondent of the Denver Republican, approached the train and asked to see the officer in command. A soldier roughly pushed him back at the point of a revolver, and with an oath, ordered him away.

"I was standing in the line of citizens, some distance away, when this incident was reported to me by some one in the crowd. I laughed and remarked, jokingly, that as Col. Seeley had consistently supported Gov. Peabody in all his high-handed moves, it was appropriate that he should receive this treatment.

"A patrol hearing the word 'Peabody' rushed at me with drawn revolver and, shoving it against my stomach pushed me roughly back. Four or five more rushed at me and with revolvers at my head and bayonets at my back, hustled me across the platform into the depot, applying vile epithets to me and threatening my life if I resisted.

"La Junta is a shop town with considerable population of railroad employes and other workmen and I think the militia feared interference, but without cause. They seemed to be much excited and nervous.

"This is, however, on a par with the actions of the militia in other places under the immediate instructions and example of Adjutant General Sherman Bell, who is entirely unfit for the responsible position he holds. I was uninjured by the assault, except a slight bayonet prick and bruises.
