MANY RESOURCES OF ISOLAT-ED MOUNTAIN DISTRICT.

Sheepraising the Principal Industry-Native Granite, Marble and Building Stone Found in Great Quantities-Shearing Plants Handle Nearly 300,-000 Sheep This Year-Shearers Make \$6.50 Per Day.

Enterprise, Ore., June 27.-Enterprise is beautifully located in the heart of the fertile and picturesque Wallowa valley. It is in the shadow of the snow-crowned mountains. It is substantially built and shows signs of thrift and growth. It has a large ter-ritory tributary to it. It is a good town and people are not frozen to their money. I know this for I took in \$22.50 today for subscriptions to the East Oregonian.

The most apparent industry of the town is the sheep businessstant procession of wagons of wool rough the town bound for A few miles distant near Wallake, excellent copper ore is to be found, while granite, marble and building stone are not far distant and are found in large quantities.

Today I met S. H. Cottrell, who was running sheep near Pilot Rock until the last year or two. He is a man-ager of the Weiser River Sheep Shear-They have a 40-machine plant near here. They have already sheared 20,000 sheep and have booked 33,000 more.

They have several stations using in machines. They charge cents per head to pasture, shear and bag the wool. They pay the sheepshearers 8 cents per head. Go-shearers average 100 sheep a day. talked with one of the shearers, Mr. Palmer of Weston, who said he averaged \$6.50 clear a day, board costing him \$1.00 a day.

Mr. Cottrell says the machines cut closer with less injury to the sheep than under the old hand shearing method. They get from 12 to 20 ounces more wool, which pays for the shearing. During the season with what is already booked ahead Mr. Cottrell's company will handle at their various stations 258,000 sheep.

I expect to go out to the camp, and if i do I will give additional facts. Those who know, claim that where sheep have once been sheared by machine, the owners will not go back to the old hand shearing.—Fred Lockley.


