GRADES RESTORED

ACADEMY REINSTATES
INTERMEDIATE DEPARTMENT.

Constant Request From Patrons for Lower Grades Had Actuated Executive Committee to Re-establish Accommodations for Scholars of Intermediate Grades—Dormitory May Also Be Established for the Academy.

Owing to the urgent request from former patrons of Pendleton academy the executive committee last night decided to reinstate the intermediate department of the academy, which had been eliminated in the recent rearrangement.

Many pupils have started into the academy at the primary grade and have become attached to it and its methods of teaching, and there is a constant request for accommodation of scholars in the intermediate grades. An assistant teacher will be employed to teach all coming into these grades and it is hoped by this method to meet, in a measure, the demand for a continuous course in the academy.

Many families have heretofore moved to this city for the benefit of the intermediate grades, and this arrangement will be a special invitation to them to return.

It is also possible that dormitory arrangements to accommodate the bulk of academy pupils will be made before the opening of the year.


