

RATES ARE RAISED

CONCESSIONS MADE
HAVE BEEN REVOKED.

Mixed Carload Lots Are Increased and Also Tables From Common Woods—Wagon Rate Cancelled and No Promise of Anything Better—Rates on Windmills and Component Parts Raised, and Also on School Furniture.

Printer's proofs of the new freight tariffs have arrived in Spokane, says the Spokesman-Review, and several changes are made in them raising the rates received in the city about a week and a half ago. The furniture men are affected more by the raises than any other line of business, but as they already have terminal rates in many things the railroad men say they are still allowed all of the 100 miles of territory agreed upon at the Chicago conference.

The new tariff first gave a rate on mixed carloads of furniture, with 12,000 pounds minimum, of \$2.20 from all eastern points. The proof received yesterday has raised that \$2.75 from Atlantic coast points, \$2.50 from Chicago and \$2.20 from St. Paul.

The rate of desks and bookcases of \$1.75 from New York and \$1.50 from Chicago and St. Paul is taken out entirely.

The rate on kindergarten seats and tables was fixed at \$1.30 from New York and Chicago and \$1.20 from St. Paul. That rate is removed and those articles are classed with school seats which have the rate of \$1.30 from New York removed. The rate from Chicago is raised to \$1.65. The rate from St. Paul is raised from \$1.20 to \$1.45.

A flat rate of \$1.10 was first assigned to mattresses and iron frames, but that is changed to \$1.95 from New York, \$1.79 from Chicago and \$1.63 from St. Paul.

Raises Table Rates.

The rate on unfinished tables of \$1.50 from New York and \$1.20 from St. Paul is cut out and the rate on tables and table supplies made from common woods from Chicago is raised from \$1.35 to \$1.73. The rate from St. Paul is raised from \$1.20 to \$1.53. The flat rate of \$1.85 on fuse cloth in bales is canceled.

The rate of pig iron is canceled. It was fixed at 75 cents from New York and 50 cents from Chicago and St. Paul.

The rate on wooden mantels shipped at the owner's risk of breakage and chafing, is changed from the flat rate of \$1.50 to \$2.35 from New York and Chicago, and \$2.20 from St. Paul. The car is allowed to contain not to exceed one grate for each mantel. The rate on iron and slate mantels

was \$1.10 from all eastern points. It is raised to \$1.95 from New York, \$1.70 from Chicago and \$1.45 from St. Paul.

The rate on wagons was named at \$1.60 from New York and Chicago and \$1.45 from St. Paul. The whole rate is canceled according to the new sheets.

Windmills and their component parts were given a flat rate of \$1.25. That is changed to \$1.75 from New York, \$1.65 from Chicago and \$1.45 from St. Paul.

A flat rate of \$1.24 on sulphate of zinc is raised to \$1.34.

OREGON'S PRUNES

FESTIVAL OF OREGON
FRUIT AT ST. LOUIS FAIR.

Cooked Fruit Served to the Multitude of Visitors, as an Advertisement of Oregon—Twenty-five Crates of Cherries Given Away to Visitors to the Oregon Building on Day of Dedication.

St. Louis, June 30.—Daily demonstrations of Oregon prunes are now being held in the Agricultural Palace of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, with the results that the fruit is becoming very well known to fair visitors.

The prunes used are the regular variety grown in the Willamette valley, and are kept on hand in large supplies, as many pounds are used each day.

The demonstrations have been under the direction of Charles V. Galloway, of Yamhill county, who thoroughly understands the horticultural conditions of the state. Mr. Galloway has been appointed superintendent of horticulture by the Oregon state commission and now has a first-class display at St. Louis.

This method of advertising Oregon fruit is considered a good one, and already Oregon prunes are well known around the fair. The first day they were given out, it took over five gallons an hour of the stewed fruit to satisfy the people who wanted a sample. About 10 gallons are now used every day, and there are always plenty of people on hand to eat them.

Twenty-five crates of cherries given away on dedication day also showed visitors what sort of fruit is to be had in Oregon, and many were the words of praise heard from every side on the generosity of the state in feeding the multitude.

Later on the commission will endeavor to keep plenty of Oregon apples and pears on hand for distribution. Other Oregon fruit will be given out in season, so that visitors will know what to expect in Oregon in 1905.
