State Bar of Washington.

Seattle, Wash., July 7.—A prominent feature of the annual meeting of the Washington State Bar Association, which began here today, will be a general debate on the subject of the railroad merger as it applied to this state. Several of the most eminent lawyers and jurists of the state will take part in the discussion. At the opening session held this morning in the federal court room President W. A. Peters, of this city, presented his annual address. The sessions will continue through the remainder of the week. Prominent among the participants are Judge H. S. Elliott of Chehalis, E. C. MacDonald of Spokane, Judge Carroll B. Graves of Ellensburg, and Judge Frank H. Rudkin of North Yakima.

Execution of Toledo Murderer.

Columbus, O., July 7.—The greatest care has been taken to assure success and quick work at the execution in the penitentiary annex today, of Albert Fisher. At his own request Fisher was permitted to take part a few weeks ago in a rehearsal of the scene in the death chamber, even to the adjustment of the black cap and straps. This was done in order to prevent any bungling and delay when the time comes for turning on the death current. The crime for which Fisher pays the death penalty was the murder of William Marshall, a bartender, in Toledo early last spring.

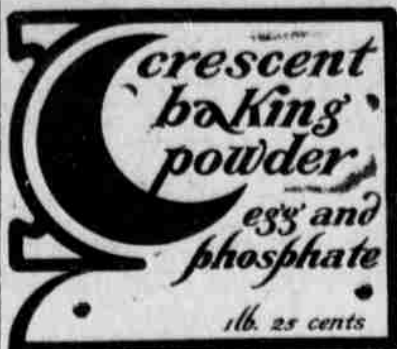
