WEEK WAS STORMY

EASTERN OREGON VISITED BY SEVERE RAINS.

Drought in Western Portion of the State Continues to Threaten Crops—Oats in Many Places Will Head Out Short—Spring Sown Grain in Willamette Valley Will Be Cut for Hay, as it Did Not Fill Sufficient to Make Grain.

Following is the government crop report for the week:

During the past week the rainfall in the eastern sections of the state has been ample, and in some limited areas it has been excessive and attended by high winds and hail, which have done considerable damage to the crops lying within the tracks of these storms. In the western section of the state drought continues and no rain of consequence has occurred since June 2d, except in some of the coast counties and in the high level sections of Southern Oregon, where local rains have fallen and greatly improved late crops.

Fall wheat is filling nicely and its harvest will become general this week. Fall barley is also maturing and promises to yield above the average. Early sown spring grain is ripening and a fair crop will be harvested. Late sown spring wheat in the Willamette valley is very poor; some of it has already been cut for hay and some will not pay to cut even for this purpose.

Good rains within the next few days will help some fields of late sown spring wheat, but most of it is too far advanced to be benefited, and this part of the wheat crop, which, fortunately, comprises but a small proportion of the whole, is considered a failure. Oats are heading short and yields below the average are expected. Corn is doing fairly well. Pasture is drying up. Stock generally keep in good condition, but there is a falling off in the flow of milk among the dairy herds. Haying is nearly finished, and the crop, although light, was secured in excellent condition.

Hops, potatoes and gardens are uneven; where rain has fallen they are doing well; where drought prevails they are from poor to good, depending upon their cultivation and the capacity of the soil for retaining moisture.

Peaches are beginning to get ripe and a fair crop will be picked. The cherry season is drawing to a close, and the yields are much better than expected.

Plateau Region.

Baker City, Baker county, W. C. McGuiness—Nearly a third of an inch of rain has fallen in Baker City the past week, and thunderstorms have occurred in the vicinity every day; there have been heavy rains in Powder River valley, and in some places so heavy that grain has been prostrated; the late frosts damaged parts of wheat fields, some of which have been cut and used for feeding stock; pasturage good and stock in fine condition.

Union, Union county, John W. Minnick—Hot days, with thunder showers in streaks, doing an immense amount of good is offsetting the effects of the late frosts; haying has just begun; the crop so far is reported light; early grain is beginning to ripen; spring grain greatly improved by the late showers.

Clarno, Wheeler county, L. H. Hale—Heavy showers have damaged the second crop of alfalfa, and hail knocked some of the fruit off; uncultivated hay is badly damaged.

Westfall, Malheur county, J. D. Fairman—Haying retarded by thunder showers; heavy rains at heads of creeks have raised them greatly and made plenty of water for second crop; fruit crop heavy; gardens poor; freeze in June hurt them; hay crop good; grass fine; stock fat.

Columbia River Valley. Kingsley, Wasco county, G. J. Friend—Weather fine first of week, with a nice shower Friday; haying well along; wheat well headed and filled and will be ready to cut soon; cherries ripe; gardens looking fine yet; grass drying up.

Gooseberry, Morrow county, C. E. Lundell—Beneficial rain Wednesday; will help late grain and garden truck; fall grain too far advanced to be helped very much, and the berry will be small and shrunken; barley ready to be harvested.

Olex, Gilliam county, George W. Marvel—Frequent thunder showers; harvesting commenced; fall wheat is a fair crop; spring wheat has im-

proved and will be very much better than expected; rains improved vegetation generally.

Adams, Umatilla county, C. S. Ferguson—Warm and sultry; grain doing well; corn, potatoes and alfalfa making excellent growth; harvest will be delayed on account of damp weather, but grain will be better for it; haying held back on account of rains.

BET SUGAR CROP

TOTAL OUTPUT FOR 1904 164,500 TONS.

Poor Crop Conditions and Lack of Rain in California Has Reduced Yield in That State—Many States Are Increasing in Beet Acreage Every Year.

The possible yield of sugar beets in the United States, based on the average output of the last two seasons, shows some interesting comparisons. Although the figures of the prospective yield at present show up somewhat smaller than last year, the fact should be taken into consideration that the weather conditions during the growing season may materially alter the prospects.

Prospects in Oregon are considered very favorable, though in California the outlook is not so good. Beets in Michigan are doing very well as compared with the early part of the last two seasons.

Poor crops of late in Michigan and lack of rain in California account for the falling off in the acreage of these two important sugar beet producing states. In other states the weather conditions have thus far been about normal, and the crops have made a fair start.

The factory at Grand Junction, Col., will be started up again this year, one new factory is building in Idaho and three are being moved, one from New York to Idaho, one from Michigan to Wisconsin and one from Canada to Wisconsin. The figures for this season show an estimated reduction from those of last year of one factory, 40,195 acres sowings and 23,635 tons of sugar.

A leading sugar firm of New York published in May a preliminary estimate of the sowings, showing a total of 251,900 acres which, on the basis of last year's out-turn, indicated a production of about 179,000 tons sugar, with the prospect of a slight improvement on these figures.

The usual time for planting having passed, they now give the following close estimate, based on their latest information, received from the best sources, showing the acreage of sowings of the new beet crop by states:
