Some hop men say that the welcome moisture will have a tendency to revive the yards which are suffering so severely on account of the drouth and that the yield would be increased by several thousand bales thereby.

The total yield for the state has been variously estimated at from 65,000 to 80,000 bales, but it is thought that the latter figure will come nearer the truth. Some dealers think the 1904 market will open at 25 cents for choice hops, while others say that, in their estimation, 20 cents will be a pretty good opening figure.

DEEPEN NEW YORK HARBOR.

Launching of Big Steamer Baltic Discloses Startling Condition. New York, July 21.—The recent departure of the gigantic new liner Baltic on its first return trip demonstrated an interesting feature.

The steamer was compelled to start out with a light load, about five or six thousand tons less than its capacity, to be able to get out of the harbor. With a full load the Baltic draws about 36 feet of water, from four to five more than the depth of the water at the bar.

The work is slowly progressing, but it is believed that it will be about four years before the water will be deep enough to enable steamers of the size and capacity of the Baltic to pass in and out with full loads.
