# WAS A LOST MINE

FABULOUS FIND BY A SOUTHERN OREGON BOY.

A Pioneer of Southern Oregon Thinks the Ledge Found by Young Briggs Is a Mine Found During the Indian War of 1855. But Forgotten and Lost Afterward — One Man Spent His Life and Fortune Trying to Relocate It.

Jacob Schmitt, a Jackson county pioneer, who is a delegate to the A. O. U. W. grand lodge meeting, says that the fabulous strike made by the Briggs family on Sucker creek, in Southern Oregon, is another case of a lost bonanza found, and avers that the wonderful ledge was first discovered in 1855, says the Oregon Daily Journal.

Mr. Schmitt has for many years been a resident of Jacksonville, the oldest and in its day the richest mining camp in Oregon. He is a cooper by trade, but in his old age he follows horticulture and carpentering in their respective seasons, and between times he goes prospecting.

This has been his habit for years, and he has in his career met nearly all the mining men of note in the state. This is his story of the first Sucker creek strike:

"When the Indian troubles of 1855 began, two men named Belleville and Miller, who were coming to join the Indian fighters, crossed a range of mountains about 40 miles southeast of Jacksonville, and there struck a ledge from which they took some quartz that was nearly pure gold.

Each man carried away a small piece, intending to go back after the Indian war was over and work the mine. On their way next day they got lost and afterward they never were able to re-locate the place. Belleville was the only man who came into Jacksonville with his specimen.

It was about a quarter of a pound. He got \$100 for it. He told me, in describing the place, that on the top of a high mountain near the quartz vein they could see the ocean.

given of the Briggs ledge and it is the only place in that district where the ocean can be seen. Belleville spent the remainder of his life and all the money he could earn trying to re-locate the ledge, but died without finding it. Miller also is dead.

But their ledge has at last been found accidentally by a farmer boy out hunting, who probably never even heard of Belleville or Miller.

The Briggs have at present \$65,000 in gold in the bank at Grant's Pass, and enough more in sight at the ledge to make fortunes for all of them."

### SAMURAI AND JIU-JITSU.

The Most Wonderful System of Athletics in the World.

More than 2,500 years ago there sprang into existence in Japan an order of knights who were known as the samurai. To them was imparted all the learning, the polite breeding and the forms of superiority that mark the gentleman. They were skilled in arms and versed in the arts of war, for they were the emperor's fighting men, and none but they were allowed to bear arms.

As there could not always be war on hand, and as it was considered beneath the dignity of the samurai to go into any ordinary callings, it came about naturally that these little knights found much idle time on their hands. Being men of war, they turned their attention to athletic feats.

One among the samurai conceived the idea of learning by practice the location of every sensitive nerve and muscle in the body. After that he discovered all the joints of the bones that could be seized in such a way as to give momentary power over the muscles of an adversary. He practiced with his fellow samurai, and thus by degrees was developed the most wonderful system of athletics known in the world.

The Japanese call this work jiu-jitsu. The deft pressures applied in the practice of jiu-jitsu produce only momentary pain, but do not really injure the muscles or nerves. In all other things the Japanese are the most polite people in the world. So it follows that even in their fighting they have developed a humane yet effective method of self defense. They do not strike out with the clinched fist and seek to bruise, as do the Anglo-Saxons in their boxing contests.

A knowledge of jiu-jitsu enables one almost instantly to convince his opponent that it is useless to fight. There are now schools of jiu-jitsu everywhere in Japan. Every soldier, sailor and policeman is obliged to perfect himself in the system. A Japanese policeman, possessed of the art, has been known single handed to reduce to submission and to take to the police station four sturdy sailors of a foreign Asiatic squadron.—St. Nicholas.
