Steps Being Taken to Curtail Production.

Greenville, S. C., July 26.-The cot-on manufacturers of North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia and Alabama met here today to definitely settle what the curtailment of production shall be. At a meeting of leading cot-ton mill men two weeks ago, it was agreed that no goods be sold up to the present date for less than a reduction of 8 3-8 cents per pound from what print cloths were selling at four months ago.

The manufacturers contend that it is of the utmost importance that they cotton goods for the past three months.
