IRRIGATION IS HAPPY THEME

THIRD MEETING OF OREGON ASSOCIATION AT ONTARIO.

Three Days' Session to Be Held on September 19, 20 and 21—Prominent Speakers Will Be Present and an Agricultural Exhibit Will Be Collected—Ontario Will Eclipse All Other Meetings of the Association.

To make the third annual meeting of the Oregon Irrigation Association excel any other meeting ever held is the intention of Malheur county, and from the elaborate arrangements under way by the various committees the goal will be reached.

Committees on arrangements, finance, decorations, speakers, transportation, prizes, exhibits and other features of the meeting, have been appointed by the Malheur County Irrigation Association, and by the city of Ontario, where the meeting will be held on September 19, 20 and 21.

Prominent Speakers Coming.

The following speakers have accepted invitations to be present and deliver addresses on that occasion: Governor Chamberlain, Senators Mitchell and Fulton, Congressmen Williamson and Hermann of Oregon, Governor Morrison of Idaho, Dr. Jas. Withycombe, director of the experiment station of the Oregon agricultural college at Corvallis, A. Bennett, vice-president of the Oregon Development league.

Chairman Solles, of the committee on speakers, is also communicating with other prominent speakers and arrangements are being made for an elaborate, instructive and interesting program.

Enthusiasm is Great.

The enthusiasm of Malheur county over the almost certain prospect of securing government aid in reclaiming her deserts has caused a reawakening of the subject in all the Eastern Oregon districts and the best possible showing of irrigated products will be made at this coming meeting of the state association.

After the regular program is over, it is the program now to hold a picnic in the grove at Arcadia, drive the delegates to the Ontario salmon hatchery, near the city, and show the visitors something of the result of irrigation in the wonderful Malheur region.

Cheap fares will be made on the O. R. & N. and Short Line, and prominent citizens from all over Eastern Oregon will be present whether delegates or not, to listen to the proceedings and get in touch with the actual irrigation forces of the state of Oregon.

Fine Exhibit to Be Collected.

One of the most important features of the meeting will be an irrigated product exhibit from all over the state. Malheur county will make an especially fine exhibit of grains, alfalfa, honey, fruits and vegetables, and other counties are invited to bring their exhibits and help swell the testimony to irrigation.

Fred J. Kissel of Ontario, will give \$100 in prizes, as follows: \$20 for the best display of sugar beets, \$20 for the best Bartlett pears, \$20 for the best tomatoes, \$20 for the best apples, \$20 for the best prunes or Hungarian prunes.

C. C. Hunt of Ontario, is assistant secretary of the state association and all information concerning the arrangements will be cheerfully furnished by him.

Bristow, and afterward his chief clerk. Upon Mr. Root's resignation and the appointment of Secretary Taft, Mr. Chance was made superintendent of the division of supplies of the postoffice department, to succeed Michael A. W. Lewis, who resigned in the course of the investigation of the department.

ENGINES RENUMBERED.

O. R. & N. 400's Are Now Numbered From 179 to 184 to Correspond to Other Engines on the System.

There are no more "400's" on the O. R. & N.

The new compound engines that boasted the designation as the "400 class," have been reduced in ranks.

They consisted of the 400, 401, 402, 403, 404 and 405 and were the "queens of the rail" as far as engines were concerned on the system. In order to make the numbers of all the engines conform to a regular system, these engines have been numbered from 179 to 184 inclusive, because the number of the same class of engines on the Harriman system stopped at 178, and there must be no break in the numbers.

Another reason for renumbering these engines while yet in service here is that they are soon to be succeeded by a new class of passenger engine, faster, stronger, more suited to heavy hills and long trains, if possible, and these will go elsewhere.

Just where these engines will be sent is not yet known, but in the intricate meandering of the locomotive's career, they are to be forwarded somewhere along the line where they will be better adapted to the traffic, and like the old railroad man, where the company needs them.

MUSCOVITE MISERY

PESTILENTIAL FOOD AND A HOMICIDAL CLIMATE.

Sunstroke and Heatstroke Cause Paralysis—Heavy Rains, Extreme Heat and Unfit Food Are Decimating the Russian Army—The Most Awful Conditions Under Which Russian Soldiers Ever Fought.

St. Petersburg, Aug. 20.—Harrowing descriptions of the effects of the heavy rains, the deep mud and tropical heat, and the consumption of unfit fruits on the health of the Russian soldiers around Liao Yang are published by the St. Petersburg papers. One correspondent telegraphs:

A roaring torrent of yellow waves is rolling down the Liao Yang mountain streams, which have flooded the surrounding country, and in order to reach the second Russian position one has to cross them 10 times. The Cossacks ford the streams on their horses, whose haunches are covered by the water, while foot soldiers undress and raise their rifles above their heads. Battalions of our troops climb hills thus wet to the marrow and faded. Carts, guns and two-wheeled vehicles conveying ammunition sink fast in the mud. Boots are coated with dirt, and the entire uniform is soaked through and through, in spite of mackintoshes and "waterfalls," in the rain which falls in torrents from the saddles and from horses.

Greeks and Tartars have opened numerous shops in which they are selling inferior wares obtained from Yin Kow and Harbin. The railway battalion supplies us with tailors and shoemakers. Prices are pretty high, but there are workshops and stores, and everything needful can be found in Liao Yang. The Greeks have brought as German, Danish and Japanese beer, champagne and liquors. The food at the hotels is inferior, but nothing is lacking—not even billiards. The climate is homicidal. The heavy rains are accompanied by tropical heat. Sunstroke and heatstrokes are frequent, and often produce heart paralysis.

It is impossible to drink water from the stream, and the troops depend upon the hot tea with which they are supplied. The vegetables to be obtained, and especially the Chinese cucumbers, are most harmful, but our soldiers eat them, even on the march. Worst of all, however, is Manchurian dirt. Exposed to the rain, in slush and slimy mud, our brave soldiers perish who are otherwise able to endure the hardship and sufferings of a campaign. Never before have Russian troops been called upon to fight under such terrible conditions.

Bible Students at Winona Lake.

Winona Lake, Ind., Aug. 20.—The tenth annual Winona Bible conference and international gathering of Bible students will open here tomorrow and continue for 10 days. All of the meetings will be under the direction of the Rev. J. Wilbur Chapman, the founder of the conference, and he will be assisted by noted Evangelists and Christian workers from all parts of this country as well as from foreign lands. The Rev. Frank W. Gunsaulus of Chicago, the Rev. Mr. Odell of London, the Rev. A. C. Dixon of Boston, President Edwin H. Hughes, of DePaul University, and the Rev. Robert F. Coyle of Denver are among the prominent men who will take part.
