WARSHIP LAUNCHED

MOST POWERFUL VESSEL IN THE AMERICAN NAVY.

Will Have One Equal When the Con-

ment of Louisiana Said to Be the Most Powerful in the World-Her Driving Engines Have 16,500 Horse Power-Carries 900 Tons of Coal and Cost \$4,000,000.

Newport News, Va., Aug. 27.-In the presence of 20,000 persons the battleship Louisiana was launched today by the Newport News Shipbuilding Company. In addition to the official party from New Orleans there. were present delegations of naval officers from Washington, Philadelphia and New York, and visitors from numcrous other points.

The naming party was escorted to the platform by C. B. Orcutt, president of the shipbuilding company. The sponsor, Miss Juanita Lalland of New Orleans, was attended by several young ladies as maids of honor. Governor Blanchard and other official representatives of the state of Louisiana were present.

soon as the ceremonles were over President Orcutt conducted the guests, numbering some 500 persons. steamboat Newport News aboard which the party went to Old Point Comfort, where they were entertained at a banquet in the dining room of the Hotel Chamberlin.

Description of Battleship Louisiana.

The Louisiana and her sister ship. the Connecticut, which is to be launched at the New York navy yard a few weeks hence, are counted upon to be the most powerful fighting machines of the new American navy. They will usher in one important innovation, inasmuch as their batteries will contain 7-inch guns in place of the 6-inch rapid-firers which have prevailed since the vessels of the Kearsarge-Kentucky type were planned. It is doubtful whether any ship afloat will match the Louisiana in armament. In addition to four 12-inch guns, in fore and aft turrets, she will have eight 8-inch rifles. In the main battery these will be supplemented by 12 inch rifles, each throwing a projeclle weighing 165 pounds.

The 42-inch guns carry a shell weighing 850 pounds at a velocity of greater than that attained by the 13inch guns on the ships of the Indiana The 7-inch shells have a bursting charge of 13 pounds of black pow-The explosive shell may be replaced by an armor piercing projectile, which attains a velocity of 3000 feet a second, driven by a charge of pounds of smokeless powder,

Hitherto the secondary batteries of the battleships have been composed mostly of 3-pounder and 6-pounder rapid-fire guns. On the Louisiana these will be superseded by 20 3-inch rapid-fire rifles, throwing a 14-pound explosive shell. There also will be 3-pounder semi-automatic guns. two 3-inch field guns and eight machine guns for the fighting tops.

The armor for the Louisiana will cost about \$1,500,000. While greatest of her steel prote tion will be concentrated at the water line amidships, she also will be protected the full length of her hull, and above the main belt of armor plate there will be three thinner belts of plates-the lower casemate, the upper casemate and the superstructure armor.

Electricity will be employed to as large an extent on board the Louisiann as on any ship in the navy. There will be electric ammunition hoists and conveyers, and it is more than probable that electrical devices for both aiming and discharging the guns will be installed. There also will be an automatically controlled motor for the purpose of keeping the big guns on horizontal line while firing in a

The Louisiana has a length of 450 feet on the load water line, an extreme breadth of 76 feet 10 inches, and a total displacement of 16,000 She will be fitted with twinvertical expansion engines of an indicated horse power of 16,500, and capable of developing a speed of 18 knots or better.

The mean draught of the vessel will be 24 feet 6 inches, and the coal supply 900 tons. Twenty-six feet nine inches is the maximum draught, and if a shot sould pierce the hull beneath the water line, a layer of compith, placed between the outer and inner shells, will swell and effectually stop the leak. The ship's complement will include 42 officers and 761 men.

The total cost of the Louisiana will be in the neighborhood of \$4,000, The progress of her construction is being watched intently by naval officers, constructors and shipbuilders generally, owing to the competition between the private company that is building her and the New York navy yard which is constructing the Connecticut. The construction these two ships, which are practically identical and the keels of which were laid at the same time, is intended to show whether the government can successfully compete with the private shipbuilders in constructing our warships. The Newport News Company has won the race so far in regard to time and naval experts seem to be of the opinion that the private concern will also succeed in turning out the battleship at a lower cost than the government navy yard.
