RATES ARE REDUCED

RAILROADS FAVOR WEST-ERN LIVESTOCK MEN.

Passenger Association Makes Cheap Rate From Pacific Coast Points to Denver Meeting of Livestock Association in January-Secretary Martin Says the Best Rate Ever Offered Has Just Been Made.
