A LITERARY BUREAU

SENATOR HILL EXPOSES SOME CAMPAIGN SCHEMES.

Shows Up Roosevelt's Alliance With Literary Man to Get Himself Square With the Magazine Readers—How the Administration Makes a Grandstand Play With New York Republican Leaders as Supes.

Whitney's Point, N. Y., Sept. 3.—Former Senator David B. Hill was the orator of the day at the Broome county fair this afternoon and attracted a great crowd.

Mr. Hill said that the democratic platform was silent on the money question because that question was deemed settled. The almost unanimous approval by the convention of Judge Parker's telegram operated virtually as an amendment to the platform in accordance with its terms and the new platform necessarily superseded and eliminated all previous national platforms.

The present campaign on the part of the republicans, the ex-senator declared, "is one of humbug and false pretenses—peculiarly Rooseveltish in all its essential characteristics. The president through himself and his late private secretary, manage and direct every detail, while experienced political managers of long service in the party are brushed aside and ignored."

Mr. Hill sharply criticized Mr. Roosevelt's method of employing magazine writers to give out his views and especially attacked William Allen White's article, "How Roosevelt Uncovered the Postal Frauds." He quoted: "When it (the investigation) touched the president's friends and political sponsor, State Senator Green of Binghamton, N. Y., and when he was about to be indicted for crookedness, the two senators from New York, and every prominent republican in the state begged for mercy and then threatened President Roosevelt for allowing Bristow to indict Green."

"If true," Mr. Hill went on, "this is a most serious accusation. It virtually accuses our two republican United States senators and also every prominent republican in the state with a crime. But it uplifts Roosevelt and he apparently delights to be exalted at the expense of others."

"Who," the speaker inquired, "but the president himself could have furnished him this exclusive information which he now discloses to the public? It is believed that the charge is utterly groundless; that its publication was intended as a spectacular and sensational performance, and that it was concocted especially to aid the president in the present contest regardless of its damaging effect upon others. Being false is one essential particular, the whole article should be discredited."

GREAT FIRE AT GEM.

Idaho Town Nearly Annihilated Last Night.

Wallace, Idaho, Sept. 3.—Fire which started shortly after 9 o'clock tonight swept the entire business portion of Gem, Idaho, and a large part of the residence district, entailing a loss of \$150,000, destroying nearly 100 houses and rendering scores of people homeless. The houses were occupied for the most part by miners, many of whom moved to Gem after the Black Bear conflagration three months ago. In almost every case all their belongings, which were purchased only since that fire, were destroyed.

The fire started in the Frisco cafe, in an unoccupied building. When discovered it had a good start. The alarm was immediately given and a rush was made for fire apparatus. When hose was coupled onto the hydrant there was found to be no water, so the residents were forced to stand by and see the town swept by the flames.

The cause of the fire is unknown, but it is supposed to have been started by some drunken man in the vacant building. With two exceptions all the buildings in town were frame. White & Bender's store building, in the lower part of town, was surrounded by burning cottages and stores, but withstood the flames, and the stock of \$30,000 or over escaped with little damage.

Telephone, telegraph, electric light wires and the power line of the Washington Water Power Company were destroyed. Both the O. R. & N. and Northern Pacific suffered some damage, having rails and platforms damaged. The former lost a bridge over Canyon creek near the center of town.

Gem is located in a narrow part of the canyon. On one side runs the O. R. & N. railway, while the Northern Pacific passes through the only street of the town. The houses were built on either side of the track and very close to it. The burned area is nearly 1000 feet long, and the houses, which were built closely together, were burned to the ground.
