

NEW PHONE SYSTEM

INSPECTING ENGINEER MILLER LOOKS OVER CHANGES.

New Express System Cannot Be Put Into Operation Until Power Plant is Completed, As Electric Power Cannot Be Supplied Now to Charge Additional Batteries—New Switchboard Being Built in San Francisco—Will Require Two Horse Power to Operate and Light the New Board.

Inspecting Engineer Elam Miller, of the Pacific States Telephone Company, with headquarters in San Francisco, was in the city yesterday inspecting the telephone system here and giving final directions concerning the changes that are being made now.

The installation of the new express system of phones here depends altogether on the completion of the new electric light plant, as it is absolutely necessary to have more power with which to charge the larger batteries of the new system before it can be put in operation.

Mechanics are now working on the new switchboard for the Pendleton office, to be used in the express system, and it will be ready for use in a short time. It is a large and very complicated affair, and its operation will require the services of an extra man in the Pendleton central office.

Mr. Miller is well pleased with the outlook of Pendleton and vicinity and said his company will furnish this city one of the best telephone systems in the United States, as soon as the electric power is available for charging the batteries. It will require about two horse power to operate and light the switchboard. It will be one of the finest boards ever turned out of the mechanical department of the Pacific States company.

Mr. Miller left this morning for Lewiston, where the Pacific States people are also making extensive changes and improvements.

ALL EYES ON VERMONT.

Election in That State Regarded as an Index.

Burlington, Vt., Sept. 5.—The eyes of the nation are on Vermont. The result of tomorrow's election in this state will be significant. It is the straw that will tell which way the political wind is blowing. If the republican majority should be light, the democrats of the country will consider it an omen of good, while, on the other hand, should the majority be heavy, the country will take it as an indication that Roosevelt will sweep the land.
