WOOLGROWERS TO MEET AT SHANIKO

STATE ASSOCIATION HOLDS SESSIONS SEPT. 20-22.

Secretary J. H. Gwinn Now Preparing Program—Successful Sales Days Conducted This Year Have Given Added Interest to Meetings of the Association—Umatilla County Will Be Well Represented—President Belts and Secretary Gwinn to Be Re-Elected.

Secretary James H. Gwinn, of the Oregon Woolgrowers' Association, is busily engaged in preparing the program for the next annual meeting of the state association, to be held in Shaniko on September 20-22.

The representation at the meeting is expected to be unusually large, as many important questions concerning the sheep industry in Oregon will be discussed. The highly successful sales days conducted under the auspices of the association this season, has given an added interest to the affairs of the association, as the members realize the value of organization and union of strength.

Congressman Williamson will be present at the meeting, and will listen to the recommendation of the sheepmen in regard to the range and forestry questions, and will also be prepared to represent Crook county, in which he is one of the most extensive sheep growers, ably and actively.

It is impossible to say who will attend from Umatilla county yet, but it is almost certain that Charles Cunningham, J. E. Smith, James Hackett, William Slusher, Perry Gould, and several Echo growers will attend, in addition to President Douglas Belts and Secretary Gwinn.

The last meeting was held in Baker City last September, and was a highly successful meeting. The membership has increased since that meeting, and the number of local organizations now include the leading sheepmen of the state.

It is confidently expected that both Mr. Belts and Mr. Gwinn will be re-elected to the positions of president and secretary, respectively, and it is possible that the next meeting will be held in Portland next September, in order to give the delegates a trip to the Lewis and Clark fair, while attending to the business of the association.

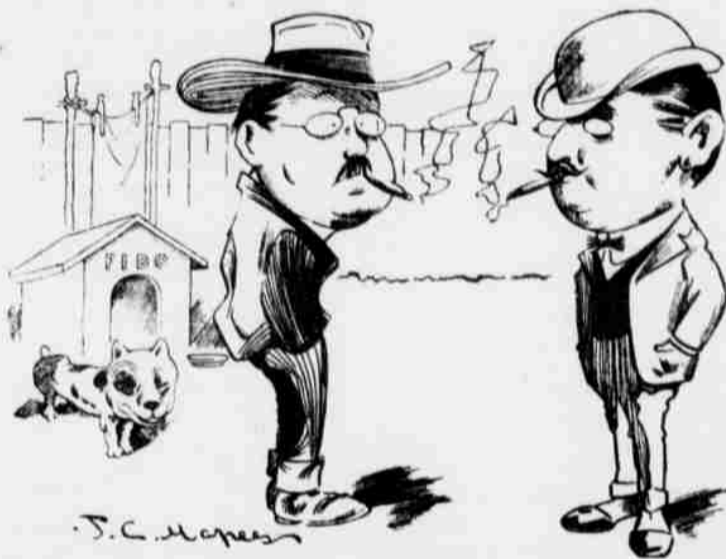
