LIGHT IS COSTLY

ELECTRIC POLE LINE TO MILTON COSTS \$9112.

In Distance of 46 Miles 1350 Poles Will Be Used at a Cost of \$6.75 Each, Between Pendleton and Power Plant—General Manager Anderson Says Talk of Electric Road Is Wind—Would Not Pay Interest on Axle Grease.

It is costing the Washington & Oregon Power Company for the erection of Poles, alone, from its station on the Walla Walla river to this city, over \$9000.

The bare poles are worth \$4 each and the placing of them in the ground ready for the wires brings the cost up to \$6.75. It is about 46 miles from this city to the power station and the poles are erected 130 feet apart. This means that 1350 poles are required, bringing the total cost up to \$9,112.50. Less than half as many poles are required on the line to Walla Walla.

Notwithstanding the fact that Walla Walla is but 16 miles from the power plant, the Washington & Oregon Power Company expects to be supplying this city with electricity before it is transmitted into the other place.

J. W. Anderson, general manager of the company, passed through Pendleton yesterday on his way to Boise. "We are endeavoring to get power into Pendleton before November 1," he said, "but I am afraid we will be a little delayed."

Speaking of the probability of an electric railway between Pendleton and Walla Walla, Mr. Anderson said, "Talk concerning such a project is not. An electric road would not pay the interest on its axle grease. It will be a good many years, I think, before a road is built."

The convention is presided over by Grand Exalted Ruler B. F. Howard of Covington, Ky.
