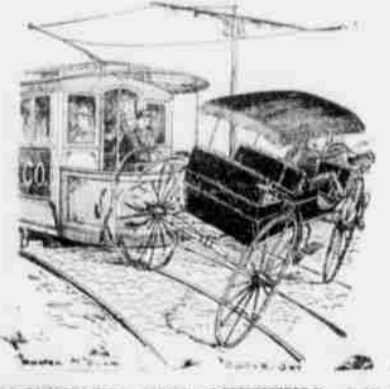

TO OPEN CAMPAIGN

DEMOCRATS WILL BEGIN

FIGHT OCTOBER FIRST.

Meeting of State Leaders Held in Portland Decides to Make a Vigorous Contest Despite the Heavy Republican Majority of June—Speakers Will Be Put in the Field First of Next Month.

Portland, Sept. 12.—Local headquarters for the presidential campaign will be opened next week by the democratic state central committee at Hotel Scott, Seventh and Ankeny streets.

According to the plans adopted at the meeting of the committee yesterday afternoon the campaign will probably be opened in Oregon about October 1, and it is hoped that some noted speakers can be secured from the west to deliver addresses before the voters of the state.

The committee met at the office of the chairman, Alex. Eyster, whose presence being guaranteed, speakers J. H. Ryan, secretary; F. N. Holman, national committeeman; W. B. Hillard, state director for presidential electors; W. H. Holmes of Marion county; Henry Blackman of Morrow county; J. N. Wall of Washington county; and John Van Zandt, chairman of the Multnomah county democratic committee.

Arrangements for the campaign were informally discussed and it was agreed that a strong effort shall be made to bring before the voters of Oregon, through the democratic press, the issues between the two parties, and to present the grounds on which the candidacy of Parker and Davis is based.

Notwithstanding the heavy republican majority in the June election, the committee resolved to wage a campaign of education, which shall lay the foundation for future democratic success.

Gotham Entertains Geographers.

New York, Sept. 12.—The members of the International Geographic congress, including a large number of distinguished scientists and others from abroad, began a three-days' stay in New York today. Two sessions were held today, the forenoon being occupied with a discussion of oceanography at the quarters of the American Geographical Society. The session was opened with an address by Sir John Murray. This afternoon the delegates met at the American Museum of Natural History. Following the conclusion of the meetings in this city the delegates will leave for St. Louis by way of West Point, Niagara Falls and Chicago.

Jones to Box McGovern.

Baltimore, Md., Sept. 12.—The boxing season in Baltimore opens tonight with a show at the Farelka Athletic club, the wind-up of which will be furnished by "Griff" Jones of Philadelphia and Hughey McGovern. It will be the fourth time these two have faced one another in the ring, their three previous meetings all having been draws. Owing to this fact, the match has attracted much attention among the sporting fraternity and the club expects a big crowd on hand to see the little men battle. Both are reported in the pink of condition for their fistie argument.

Convenes in Extra Session.

Providence, R. I., Sept. 12.—The Rhode Island legislature convened today in extra session in response to the call recently issued by Governor Garvin. The matter to be considered and acted upon by the session relative to the governor's veto power, the constitutional initiative, providing that 5000 electors may propose specific amendments to the state constitution, and the measure conferring upon registry voters in cities, the right to vote in the election of city council.

United American Mechanics.

Portland, Me., Sept. 12.—The annual meeting of the National Council of United American Mechanics opened in Portland today, delegates being present from all sections of the country. The delegates were welcomed by the mayor and after a response by National Councilor Robert M. Johnston of Pennsylvania, the convention went into secret session. The feature of today was the big parade, in which several thousand men were in line.
