EAGLES ON PARADE

GREAT PARADE WAS A SPECTACULAR AFFAIR.

Thousands of Marching Members and Fifty Bands, Costumes, Floats and Tableaux—Live Eagles as Symbols of the Order, While Florida Carried Alligators.

Baltimore, Md., Sept. 14.—The spectacular feature of the Eagles' convention in session here was the great parade today. Thousands of members of the order were in line and 50 bands provided no end of music. The pageant embodied many new and novel features, including grotesque costumes, floats and tableaux emblematic of the various states and far distant territory of the country. The states with the largest numerical representation were Virginia, Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

The Florida Eagles had a choice collection of alligators on a float, and the delegations from Dakota, Minnesota and Colorado also displayed birds and beasts of various kinds. A Kentucky aerle appeared in line as pioneers, with rifles and axes, and the Texas aerle, as a symbol of the Lone Star state, wore silver stars on the side of their wide felt hats. The members of the Cheyenne, Wyo., aerle, of which President Roosevelt is a member, were attired as cowboys. The Denver aerle also appeared in typical Wild West costume and carried with them several bald eagles.

The line formed at 10 o'clock and traversed the principal thoroughfares of the city. Thousands of spectators lined the route and cheered the marchers. Mayor Timanus and a large party of guests reviewed the procession from a stand in front of the city hall. This afternoon the visitors were entertained at a big crab feast and outing at Riverview park.

CONFEDERATE REUNION.

Seventeenth Annual Gathering of Virginians.

Lynchburg, Va., Sept. 14.—The grand camp of Confederate Veterans of Virginia began its seventeenth annual reunion here today. The convention was called to order in Confederate hall this morning by Judge George L. Christian of Richmond, grand commander. Chaplain John P. Hyde of Winchester, delivered the invocation. Hon. N. C. Manson, Jr., welcomed the veterans to Lynchburg, and General Thomas T. Munford extended greeting in behalf of Garland-Rhodes camp. The response was by Col. William H. Stewart of Portsmouth.

At the conclusion of these formalities adjournment was taken until 4

o'clock this afternoon. The United Sons of Confederate Veterans begin their annual reunion this evening. Both bodies will continue in session through tomorrow and Friday.

Twin City Horse Show.

Minneapolis, Minn., Sept. 14.—An admirable display of horsemanship and a great outpouring of society is expected to be the feature of the horse show opening at the state fair grounds this evening. The exhibition will be the first affair of the kind in which St. Paul and Minneapolis have co-operated and it promises to be the most notable ever seen in the Northwest. It will mark the opening of the horse show circuit of the year and will be followed by the exhibitions at Omaha, Louisville, St. Louis, Kansas City, Chicago and New York.

New Jersey to Retaliate.

Trenton, N. J., Sept. 14.—At the annual convention of the New Jersey Undertakers' Association, which began here today, a committee will be appointed to draft a bill for presentation to the legislature making it a misdemeanor for undertakers doing business in New York or any other state to conduct funerals in the state of New Jersey. This action will be taken because undertakers in New Jersey have been debarred from conducting funerals in New York.

Indiana M. E. Conference.

New Albany, Ind., Sept. 14.—The annual session of the Indiana M. E. conference began at Centenary Methodist church in this city today with Bishop Warren presiding. The business of the conference will occupy a week or 10 days. The annual appointments will be announced the first of the coming week. Many prominent divines are among the delegates and there will be a series of notable lectures and sermons during the week.

Watson at Yankton.

Yankton, S. D., Sept. 14.—The populist state convention is in session here today for the purpose of naming candidates for the state offices to be filled at the November election. There appears to be little disposition on the part of the convention to endorse the nominees of the democratic state convention. Thomas Watson, candidate for president on the populist ticket, delivers an address here this afternoon.
