PRICES CONTINUE TO ADVANCE

Livestock Prices Are Unchanged - Receipts Are Small - First Cattleberries Now on the Portland Market.

Portland Union Stockyards, Sept. 15.—There is now a good demand for anything in the livestock market and prices are being more firmly held.

Receipts today consisted of 200 sheep and 100 cattle. No sheep arrivals.

Official ruling prices today: Cattle—Best Eastern Oregon steers \$12.75; best valley steers, \$12.75; medium steers \$12.50; cows, \$12; pigs, \$11; stage, \$2.

Portland Fruit Market. The first cranberries of the season are from Tillamook, and are selling at 15 per barrel.

Vegetables. Green corn, 15c to 20c dozen. Summer squash, 5c to 10c each. Carrots, 2 1/2c per lb. Potatoes, new and best, \$1.75 sack.

Fruits. Apples, \$1 box. Peaches, 70c box. Prunes, 40c dozen. Lemons, 30c dozen. Oranges, 40c per dozen.
