CAN NOT REGISTER

MARION COUNTY CLERK FINDS FLAW IN LAW.

Refuses to Register Voters Who Registered Last Spring and Have Since Changed Residence—Attorney General Will Be Asked to Pass on the Technicality in the Law—Failure to Register Causes Confusion on Election Day.

The registration of voters commenced this morning, under the provisions of the direct primary law, enacted by the people at the last election, says the Salem Journal.

The law is very indefinite, and it is doubtful if a county clerk in the state understands its provisions. The books are closed and certified to prior to the state election, and now they must be reopened, and one question that worries the clerks is whether they can re-register voters that have already registered in other counties and precincts.

County Clerk Roland this morning refused to register voters who had changed their places of residence since their former registration, alleging that the law did not contemplate such action.

He was very anxious to get a local interpretation of the section authorizing him to reopen the books, and will submit the matter to Attorney General Crawford at once, so that voters will have a chance to register.

It is very important, not only for the presidential election, but also for the city campaign, which will be conducted under the direct primary law. A failure to register will cause considerable confusion, especially in city affairs, when it comes to nominating candidates for the various offices.

Jews With Russian Forces.

Berlin, Sept. 22.—It is semi-officially announced, says an Odessa dispatch, that the limitation hitherto placed upon the number of Jewish students entering the medical faculties of the universities and medical colleges, both within and without the so-called "Southern pale," is to be greatly moderated, and, later on, not improbably abolished. The necessity for the removal, or partial removal, of this particular disability has been forced upon the government by the dearth of Russian doctors and surgeons at the front. It is admitted that about 52 per cent of the medical staff in Manchuria are Jews, and, indirectly, the reports made by commanding officers constitute a tacit acknowledgment that, professionally, the Jewish surgeons and doctors are the more capable and assiduous practitioners.

Medal of Honor Legion.

Atlantic City, N. J., Sept. 22.—The Medal of Honor Legion is holding its annual convention here with a large attendance of its members. The legion is composed of officers and enlisted men of the Union Army who, during the civil war, were awarded medals of honor for special acts of bravery and devotion. Fifteen hundred of these medals are worn by veterans of the army, and 599 by naval veterans, of which nearly one hundred were awarded on account of the war with Spain. Major General O. O. Howard, retired, is the present commander of the order, General Estess of Washington, is spoken of to succeed him.

Confederates Meet at Bristol.

Bristol, Va., Sept. 22.—Ex-Confederate veterans of Southwest Virginia and East Tennessee assembled in annual reunion here today. The gathering was held under the auspices of Fulkerson Camp, of this city, which provided elaborate entertainment for the veterans and other visitors. One of the principal features of the program was an address by ex-Governor Robert L. Taylor, of Tennessee.

Anniversary of Rebekahs.

San Francisco, Sept. 22.—This was largely a day of entertainment for the members of the sovereign grand lodge of Odd Fellows and other visitors attending the big meeting of the fraternity. The Rebekah branch of the order held a celebration of its 29th anniversary. A grand ball is to be given in honor of the visitors tonight.

Nugget for Edward's Crown.

Seattle, Sept. 22.—The largest nugget ever found in the Klondike has been sent to England's king, with the request that it be placed on the royal crown. It weighs 85 ounces, is valued at \$1250 and is entirely free from quartz. It was found in French Gulch by R. C. McCullom.

Business Houses Burn.

Montreal, Sept. 21.—The buildings of the Canada Hardware Co., Canadian branch of the London Thread trust, and Cheput, Fife & Co., the largest wholesale grocery and liquor house in Canada, was destroyed by fire early today. Loss, \$750,000.
