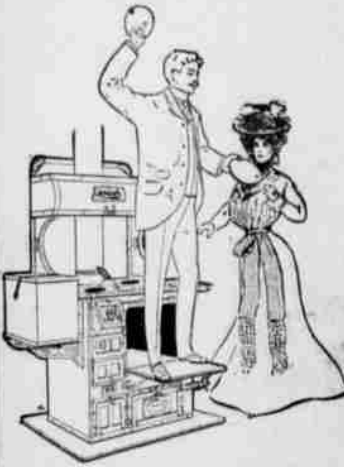

### Warde and Kidder Monday Night.

## THE BEEF BREEDS

J. C. LONERGAN SAYS SENTIMENT IS DIVIDED.

About Half and Half of the Prominent Stockmen Favor Hereford and Shorthorns—Personally, Mr. Lonergan Favors Polled Angus Beef—Only Difficulty is That This Breed Does Not "Dress Out" as it Should.

J. C. Lonergan is a staunch adherent of the belief and conviction that the very best beef animal for the Northwest is a cross between the Hereford and the Shorthorn. Not merely an animal that shows a trace of both, but that has both blood in its veins, and in as large quantity and even proportion as possible. In other words, a composite that shall be as perfect as such is possible. He takes little stock in the partisanship that sees in either breed any particular advantage over the other.

Mr. Lonergan admits that a majority of the public is prejudiced in favor of the Hereford, and that a minority of equally as smart men are staunch partisans of the Shorthorn, but he declares that some of the shrewdest and most experienced professional breeders incline to the composite, and are actually rapidly accomplishing the merging of the two famous breeds on practically even terms. The result, he declares, is the very best combination of size, shape and quality.

The Shorthorn and Hereford cross fattens easily and make the most of their feed, and are good rangers—in all these particulars being better cattle than the pure blood of either breed.

### Prefers Polled Angus.

Mr. Lonergan makes no secret of his preference for beef from Polled Angus, declaring that it is in every respect more palatable—is in fact, finer beef in grain, texture and flavor, than the beef of the Shorthorn, or the Hereford, or of the Shorthorn-Hereford cross.

But the fact that the Polled Angus does not dress out—that the average 3-year-old will not dress out more

of either of the other breeds, disqualifies it in all available markets.

Further, the Polled Angus refuses to cross successfully, as it runs out, having no staying qualities whatever. The same is true of the Aberdeen, which is a family of the Polled Angus. Breeders who have tried either, or both the Polled Angus and the Aberdeens, have cut them out entirely, as being extremely expensive, with the one recommendation, i. e., quality of meat, and nearly everything else to bring them into disfavor.

Mr. Lonergan is confident that "cattle have hit the bottom," and that from now on they will show a steady, healthy, normal advance to a good price.
