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## AGAINST DIVORCE

EPISCOPAL CHURCH  
TAKES DECIDED STAND.

Ministers Hereafter to Be Enjoined if Possible, to Refuse to Perform Ceremony for Divorced Persons—Church Will Discourage Divorce in Every Possible Way—Strong Resolution on the Subject is Adopted.

At the triennial Episcopal convention at Boston Dr. J. Houston Eccleston of Baltimore, on behalf of the committee appointed to confer with the various religious bodies regarding conformity as to the marriage of divorced persons, submitted a report. The house voted to continue the committee in office. The report is as follows:

"The committee appointed Bishop Doane, the Rev. Dr. Greer and Francis Lynde Stetson as a sub-committee to carry out the purpose of the resolution under which the commission was appointed. And in response to the note addressed by the sub-committee to the representative organizations of other religious bodies, a conference was called, which held its first meeting on the 15th of January in St. Bartholomew's parish house, New York.

"The conference was organized under the title of the Inter-church Conference on Marriage and Divorce, by the election of Bishop Doane as chairman and the Rev. Dr. W. H. Roberts as secretary. It has held several meetings, increased in numerical and in representative attendance and in interest and direct results.

It has adopted the following resolutions, which are reported to be the results so far attained:

"Resolved, That, in recognition of the comity which should exist between Christian churches, it is desirable and would tend to the increase of a spirit of Christian unity for each church represented in the conference to advise, and, if ecclesiastical authority will allow, enjoin its ministers to refuse to unite in marriage any person or persons whose marriage such minister shall have reason to believe is forbidden by the laws of the church in which either party seeking to be married holds membership."

A brief discussion on the subject of changing the legal name of the church followed the presentation of the report of the committee appointed by the last convention for the purpose of considering this issue. The report, which was made public last spring, recommended that no change be made at this time. The deputies voted unanimously to discharge the committee, provided the house of deputies should agree.

**Doctors of Middle West.**  
Cincinnati, O., Oct. 10.—The Mississippi Valley Medical Association will hold its annual meeting in this city during the three days beginning tomorrow and several hundred of the most prominent physicians of the country have already arrived to attend the meeting. Though originally planned to embrace only the states of the Mississippi valley, as its name implies, the society has gradually broadened its scope until now its membership includes eminent physicians in many parts of the country. The president of the association is Dr. Hugh T. Patrick of Chicago. The program for the coming convention provides for a general meeting at the auditorium, a reception at the Grand hotel, and a banquet at the Burnet house.

**Dispersal of Whitney Stud.**  
New York, Oct. 10.—The sale of the thoroughbred mares and stallions belonging to the late Wm. C. Whitney, which is to take place tonight in Madison Square Garden, is regarded in horse circles as the most important sale of thoroughbreds since the dispersal of the Marcus Daly Bitter Root farm. The horses are to be sold in order to settle up the Whitney estate. It is expected that many of them will be bought in by Harry Payne Whitney, who will continue the breeding of race horses at La Belle Stud farm, near Lexington, Ky. There are eight stallions in the lot to be disposed of. They are Hamburg, Medler, Yankee, Nasturtium, Tallyho Bey, Kilmarnock, Blackstock and Sandringham.

## DEMOCRATIC RALLY.

Biggest Meeting of Maryland Campaign at Baltimore.

Baltimore, Md., Oct. 10.—The democrats of Baltimore hold the big meeting of their campaign in the Lyric theater tonight. Vice-Presidential Candidate Henry G. Davis will be present and Senator Gorman will preside over the meeting. The speakers are to include Senator John W. Daniel of Virginia, former Senator David B. Hill of New York and former Senator William Pinkney Whyte of Maryland.

Tomorrow morning Messrs. Davis, Hill, Daniel and Whyte will start for their tour of West Virginia. This trip is expected to consume two weeks, and will include meetings at Wheeling, Grafton, Parkersburg, Clarksburg, Piedmont, Charleston, Huntington and the other chief cities and towns of the state. On some occasions the party will be divided, and again the whole four will meet and speak at the same place.

## Navajos to Give Fire Dance.

Albuquerque, N. M., Oct. 10.—The 24th New Mexico Territorial fair opened today with flattering prospects of success. Many visitors are already arriving and the attendance promises to be a record breaker. In addition to the exhibits representing the rich resources of the territory the attractions include numerous features of entertainment. Probably the most interesting of these is the Navajo sacred fire dance, in which 100 Indians, led by Chief Bearface will take part. It will be the first time the dance has ever been given off the Navajo reservation.

## Minnesota Baptists.

Minneapolis, Minn., Oct. 10.—Lay and clerical delegates are arriving in large numbers for the state Baptist convention which begins its sessions tonight in Calvary church and continues until the end of the week. The program gives promise of a meeting of exceptional interest to the denomination. Among the scheduled speakers are Professor C. R. Henderson of the University of Chicago; Dr. T. L. Ketman, district secretary of the American Baptist Antislavery society, and Rev. C. M. Antisdel, a well known missionary worker, lately returned from the Congo.

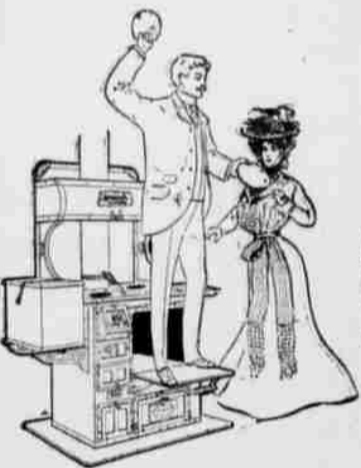
