ALASKA IS RICH.

Baker City Boy Speaks of the Untouched Natural Resources.

It's not all gold that glitters, but there are some things that are equal to gold and some mines outside of Baker county that pay dividends. Walter Martin, who graduated at the Baker City high school last year, and who spent the summer in Alaska, returned yesterday from the Far North and when interviewed, with the frankness of a young man, told both the good and the bad, says the Baker City Democrat.

"I left Baker City last April for Alaska and spent most of my time in the Kenai peninsula. I visited Valdez and Seward, the terminus of the new railway, and you can say that things are rather lively up in that country. The copper country tributary to Valdez is simply marvelous.

"The Alaska Central railway, which is being built out of Seward, is now in operation 18 miles, and has about 60 men at work. It is being built by the Tanana Construction company, and is backed by the Shedd of Chicago, who are selling stock for construction purposes.

"The country has hardly been scratched yet and is immensely rich in oil and copper. With a railroad into the interior, from either Seward or Valdez, tremendous wealth will be developed. I also visited the great Treadwell mine. I presume it is the biggest thing of its kind on earth. It now has about 1000 stamps in operation.

"That country is a great place for hunting, and big game is the rule. There is a peculiar breed of bear called the kodiak, and he is much fiercer than the grizzly. Not long ago our party shot one of these monsters 18 times with 30.30 rifles and then he turned around and killed one of the Indians of the party. A hunter alone is not considered safe in the presence of a kodiak.

"Look out for oil and copper in another year in that portion of Alaska. The coal fields are also being developed and will produce an immense tonnage."

FLOUR MILL FOR INTERIOR.

Crook County Will Have a New 100-Bushel Mill by January 1.

Arrangements have been completed for the erection of a big flour mill in the Willow creek basin at Madras and it is expected by those interested in the project that the building will be finished and the machinery set in running order by the middle of January, says the Crook County Journal.

The plant is to be installed and operated by the Wasco Warehouse Milling Company, and grounds have been secured at Madras for the new building.

The mill will have a capacity of 100 barrels per day and work on the structure and the setting of the machinery will be rushed as rapidly as possible so that the mill can be put in running order at an early date.

Residents throughout the entire Agency Plains country are greatly interested in the new project as it means a shorter haul for the products of their wheat farms, and prices generally will be about the same as they are at present.

The Madras mill will derive its entire supply from that section of the country which is abundantly able to furnish all the grain needed.

Shekel Day Tomorrow.

New York, Oct. 15.—The executive committee of the Federation of American Zionists has fixed upon tomorrow for Shekel Day. The shekel payer is one who pays 25 cents to the Zionist movement, and in return obtains the privilege of voting for a delegate to the international congress. The next congress will be held in March, 1905, and will be the most important ever held by the Zionist movement. The congress will be called upon to choose a new president to succeed the late Dr. Herzl.
