OVERABUNDANCE OF WOOD STACKED IN MOUNTAINS.

Pendleton Uses Two Brands of Coal Almost Exclusively-Not Believed That Heppner Coul Will Be a Competitor of Other Fuels Here While it Must Be Hauled in Wagons to the Railroad for Shipment.

Fuel wood is cheaper in Pendleton this fall than it has been for several seasons. Ordinary fire wood is retailing at the present time from \$6 to \$6.50 per ton. Rock Springs coal sells at \$8.50 and Roslyn at \$7. These two brands of coal are about the only used in endleton
