MEETS NEXT WEEK

NOTABLE CONVENTION OF LIVESTOCK RAISERS.

Representatives of Packing Houses, Stock Yards, Pure Food Associations and Railroads Will Be There in Force—Railroad Rates, Quarantine Laws, Irrigation and Other Subjects Will Be Considered.

Denver, Col., Jan. 7.—Unless indications are misleading the convention here next week of the National Livestock Association will be the greatest gathering of stock raisers ever held in this country. The convention will be attended by cattle growers, sheep growers, stock feeders, swine growers and representatives of railroads, packing houses, stock yards and pure record associations.

The delegates will come from Washington, Wyoming, the Dakotas, Oregon, Minnesota, Oklahoma, Iowa, Nebraska, Illinois, Colorado, Arizona, Texas and all other state and territories interested in the livestock industry.

No formal program has been prepared for the convention, but the list of subjects prepared for discussion, together with the number of prominent persons who have signified their intention to be present, assures the most notable convention in the history of the association. The governors of several of the Western states will be in attendance. Among the matters to receive attention are railroad rates, quarantine laws, irrigation and various measures of state and federal legislation in which the stock raisers are particularly interested.

FOUNDED ONE HUNDRED YEARS

Celebration of the Fact, at Columbia, South Carolina.

Columbia, S. C., Jan. 7.—Friends and alumni of South Carolina college are gathering here from far and near to take part in the celebration of the centennial of the founding of the college. The celebration will be formally opened tomorrow with appropriate

religious exercises and will continue through the two following days.

On Monday there will be addresses of welcome by President Sloan, Governor Heyward and Mayor Gibbs, with responses from the invited guests representing other educational institutions.

Prominent among the educators who have been invited to take part, and the majority of whom have accepted the invitation, are President Andrew Siedd, of the University of Florida, President James F. Venable of the University of North Carolina, President H. B. Fulton of the University of Mississippi, President Brown Ayres of the University of Tennessee, and Chancellor Walter B. Hill of the University of Georgia.

FOR DEENE INAUGURATION.

New Governor Will Greet a Great Crowd.

Springfield, Ill., Jan. 7.—Applications for accommodations at the hotels indicate that a great crowd will be on hand Monday for the inauguration of Governor Deene and the installation of the other new state officials. Arrangements for the inauguration are practically complete.

The ceremonies will take place in the state capitol at noon and will be preceded by the customary inaugural parade of the outgoing and incoming state officials and their military escort. Following the close of the inaugural ceremonies all of the prominent participants will be entertained at luncheon at the Leland hotel. The public reception in the evening will be held in the new arsenal building, the interior of which is being elaborately decorated for the occasion.

Gloomy Christmas for Russians.

St. Petersburg, Jan. 7.—The prevailing discontent and unsettled condition of business and affairs generally were reflected most noticeably in the observance of the Russian Christmas today. The festivities with which the day is usually observed in the capital is wanting and, though the day was a holiday, there was little of the holiday spirit manifested by the populace. The celebration was confined almost entirely to the holding of the customary special services in the churches.

Want Single Statehood.

Guthrie, Okla., Jan. 7.—One of the largest delegations that ever waited on congress will leave Oklahoma this evening for Washington. The purpose is to make a united effort to procure the passage of the Hamilton statehood bill. The delegation, which travels by special train, is made up of influential business and professional men representing all the principal cities and towns of the territory.

The new building for the Lewis and Clark centennial, made necessary by the demands for exhibit space, will contain 90,000 feet of floor space.

SLOCUM OWNERS WILL BE TRIED

Question of Responsibility for Loss of 1000 Lives.

New York, Jan. 7.—After every means of escape known to the law had been employed by their counsel, President Frank A. Barnaby and the other officers of the Knickerbocker Steamboat company were arraigned in the United States court today to plead to the indictment found against them as a result of the General Slocum disaster last June, whereby more than 1000 persons lost their lives.

The company of which the accused are officers, owned and operated the ill-fated steamboat. When arraigned before Judge Thomas today all pleaded not guilty to the indictment. Their trial is expected to follow within a few weeks.

Paster Trains to Mexico.

St. Louis, Mo., Jan. 7.—From 15 to 20 hours in the running time between this city and the City of Mexico will be saved by the new schedule which will be put in operation tomorrow by the National Railroad of Mexico, in conjunction with the International and Great Northern, Texas and Pacific and Iron Mountain route. The service will consist of two trains, both of which will handle mails.
