NEWS OF MILTON

CITY ELECTRIC PLANT IS A GOOD INVESTMENT.

Stands Complete and Will Be Put in Operation January 23—Already Valued in Excess of Its Cost and Nominal Value—City Also Owns Its Waterworks, and is Now Paying a Reduced Rate of Interest on Its Bonds.

Milton, Jan. 19.—The new electric plant which was to have been started Tuesday, was delayed by a small break in the lower part of the penstock. It is now mended and will be set in motion Monday, when it is expected to have as good lights as any city in Oregon.

The plant, as it stands completed, including a dwelling for the electrician, costs the city close to \$9000, and is valued at \$50,000; in fact, its value to the city cannot be told.

The cost to run the plant will not exceed \$1500 a year which, when compared with the price that the Walla Walla River Electric Co. wanted (\$4500 a year, to furnish lights) is quite an investment and saving for the city. In fact, it is expected to save above the expenses of running the plant, from \$500 to \$800 a month. With the old plant and poor lights in December \$750 was turned into the city treasury, and it is expected more will come in in January; now, with the new plant and good lights, better returns are expected.

The flume and dam, which is built the same as the W. W. R. E. Co., is nearly one-half mile long and has a fall of 46 feet, and can furnish power enough to make light for Pendleton. The city now owns its own light and water power at a cost not to exceed \$25,000, with an annual income of at least \$7500. Not only that, but the city bonds have been reduced from eight to six per cent, and sold to a Milton capitalist, which proves that she is safe to invest in.

The city council, all the members of which are prohibitionists, surely have the interest of the city at heart and are to be congratulated in the interest they have taken in her financial affairs.
