WRITES TO EAST OREGONI-

AN ABOUT PIONEER PAPER

Says the Name of the Real Founder of the Canyon City Paper, Often Credited to Hinself, is Captain Fearing, of Antelope, Ore.-Miller Was Probate Judge at That Time, in a District Larger Than all New England-No Romance Connected With His New Year's Editorial of January 1, 1869.

Readers of the East Oregonian will emember the New Year's editorial written by Joaquin Miller, for the Canyon City newspaper on January 1869, which was published in this paper a few weeks ago.

In order to get a reminiscent sketch concerning the editorial and the surroundings at the time it was written, the editor of the East Oregonian addressed a personal letter to Joaquin Miller, at his home on The Heights, Cakland, Cal. The following letter has been received in reply, written with a quill pen, in the characteristic hand writing of the "Poet of the Sierras.


