MUNICIPAL ISSUES

STATE LEAGUE HAS MET FOR GENERAL DEBATE.

Nearly All the Problems of Absorbing Interest to the Government of Michigan Towns and Cities Are Being Considered by a Convention of Officials and Others—Canadian and Municipal Union.

Lor's, Mich., Jan. 31.—A score or more of the leading cities of the state are represented by their mayors or other officials at the seventh annual convention of the League of Michigan Municipalities in session here.

"The Use of Prisoners on Streets and Roads," Otis Fuller, warden of the Michigan Reformatory; "Municipal Accounting," Howard C. Beck, deputy controller of Detroit; "The Union of Canadian Municipalities," J. W. Drake, Windsor, Ont.; "Municipal Problems in Illinois," W. C. Crollus, mayor of Joliet and president of the League of American Municipalities; "Municipal Boards," Mayor E. F. Sweet of Grand Rapids; "Municipal Organization," Moses Taggart, city attorney of Grand Rapids; "The Purification of Water," Prof. G. S. Williams, University of Michigan; "Permanent Improvements," Mayor W. W. Todd of Jackson; "Contracts vs. Municipal Labor," C. B. Pike, city surveyor of Manistee; "Municipal Government," Mayor Hugh Lyons of Lansing; "Non-Partisan Administration," Mayor Edward Prensford of Hudson, and "Theory and Practice," David A. Heineman of Detroit.

The meeting will close with the annual convention banquet tomorrow evening.

OREGON HOLDS RAIN RECORD.

Wilson, Tillamook County, Had 136 Inches of Rainfall in 1904.

Wilson, in Tillamook county, is the wettest town in the United States of which the weather bureau has any record. Rain falls there to the depth of 136 inches every 12 months.

The station is in charge of Mrs. Jennie Reehr, who has been measuring the falling waters at the same spot for the past 13 years.

Wilson nestles in a canyon, on each side of which the mountains rise to a height of 1500 feet above the level of the townsite. The weather experts are of the opinion that the topography of the country contributes very largely to the excessive rainfall.

AGAINST THE MACQUES.

Bill in the Legislature Seeks to Abolish Social Evil.

One of the most important of the bills introduced before the legislature during the present session is the one introduced before the house Thursday relative to husbands who connive at the prostitution of their wives, says the Salem Statesman.

This bill also applies to persons who live off or accept the earnings of prostitutes or who solicit persons to go to the houses of ill-fame for immoral purposes. It also provides against the admittance of females under the age of 18 years of age into houses of ill-fame.

This bill is for the direct purpose of driving out of the state the most disreputable and objectionable class of men known as "macques."

The Salem authorities are now waging a persistent and unremitting warfare against these leeches of society, but they are unable to do anything more than to convict them on the charge of vagrancy.

Cruise of Schoolship.

Philadelphia, Pa., Jan. 31.—Eighty happy youngsters waved farewell from the decks of the schoolship Saratoga as that vessel sailed down the Delaware today for her annual cruise. The cruise this year will occupy 10 weeks and will take in all the chief points in the West Indies.
