EFFORT TO REINSTATE THE UKIAH CREAMERY.

Is Sponsored by a Walla Walla Man—Stated That Camas Prairie Can Support One Thousand Milk Cows—Farmers Will Not Hand Milk to a Creamery—Stage Line Is Doing an Excellent Business.

Alba, Jan. 30.—Weather warm and sun shining bright.

All the dairymen here now that make butter have hand separators, and a creamery man will have to make them a pretty good proposition to get them to break loose and sell them the cream, as for them to haul the milk to the creamery is too frivolous to talk about. The separated milk, after being wheeled over the road eight or ten miles is not fit for the calves to drink. The farmer takes the calves into consideration, as well as the butter. Should the right inducements be offered here, Camas valley could furnish 1000 cows and then some.

Tom McQueen, the veteran stage driver, is having a warm time this winter. He says he has not got chilly holding the lines this season, and always comes in on time.

The stages on this end meet half way and return the same day. There are passengers nearly every night. The stage now changes horses at the old mill at the north end of Camas valley, 10 miles from Ukiah.
