## NO NEW CARDINAL

### CONSISTORY WILL TURN DOWN AMERICAN CLAIMS.

Division Among the American Clergy Probably Responsible—Archbishop Corrigan, Now Dead, Was Slated for the Honor—Possibility of a German Cardinal Being Created at the Coming Session.

Rome, March 8.—It can be announced on the highest authority that no new American cardinal will be created at the consistory next week. Several things make this absolutely certain. It is believed that had the late Archbishop Corrigan of New York lived he would have been made a prince of the church and the same honor bestowed on Archbishop Ireland of St. Paul. This would have given the conservatives and liberals in America each a new cardinal. The death of the New York prelate put an end to this plan.

The pope has interviewed every American prelate who has come to Rome since his elevation to the chair of St. Peter regarding the claims of the church in America to a larger representation in the sacred college. As a result of these interviews he is convinced, it is said, that the American bishops are anything but unanimous regarding the choice of the prelate to be so honored. This renders it absolutely certain that no new American cardinal will be created for some time.

As to the possibility of a foreign cardinal being chosen from some European nation other than Italy, it is the general opinion here that if such a selection is made it will be that of a new cardinal de curia for Germany, whose creation has recently been arranged with the German government.

### UNITED BRETHREN TRIENNIAL

Practical Church Union is Being Considered.

Topeka, Kas., March 8.—Arrangements are rapidly nearing completion for the reception and entertainment of the hundreds of visitors who will be here next May for the general conference of the United Brethren church. The body meets only once in three years, and there are a number of important questions to be considered at the coming meeting.

The one attracting most attention is the matter of union with the Congregationalists and the Methodist-Protestants. These two bodies have voted to form a "General Council of the United Churches," which is to meet every three or four years, but to have no power over the individual bodies except an advisory one. The proposition is said to be much favored among United Brethren and there

is believed to be little doubt of its approval by the general conference.

A further movement to be considered at the coming meeting has for its object a corporate union with the Methodist Protestants. This has already been approved by the last-named body, and the consummation of the plan now awaits United Brethren action.

### INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS.

Eastern and Western Teams Will Compete at Philadelphia.

Philadelphia, Pa., March 8.—Invitations for the intercollegiate track meet to be held here next month under the auspices of the University of Pennsylvania have already brought forth many replies, which indicate that the meet will be the most successful ever held in the history of intercollegiate athletics. The most important feature of the meet will be the presence of a number of relay teams and crack individual performers from the more important Western universities.

This will be the first time in a number of years that the Western and Eastern college athletes have met in a general meet, and because of this fact the coming meet will almost equal in importance the intercollegiate championships. The universities of Chicago, Michigan, Minnesota and Wisconsin have all accepted invitations to send relay teams and have also signified their intention of sending teams of individual stars to compete in the individual events.

### Swedish Republican Clubs.

Peoria, Ill., March 8.—Today, in accordance with its custom of many years, the Illinois Swedish-American Republican league assembled in annual convention to listen to a flow of republican oratory and to celebrate Ericson day, the anniversary of the victory of the Monitor over the Merrimac. Two business sessions were held today and were well attended by delegates from Swedish-American clubs throughout the state. Secretary of the Navy Morton will deliver the principal address of the evening.

B.; "The Forest Resources of Quebec," J. C. Langelier, department of Crown Lands, Quebec; "Forest Administration," P. G. Owen, secretary, Quebec Limit Holders' association.

### Bottlers in Session.

Milwaukee, Wis., March 8.—The Wisconsin State Bottlers' association began its third annual convention in this city today with headquarters at the Republican house. The association membership extends throughout the state and the attendance at the convention is large and representative. The two days' sessions will be occupied entirely with the discussion of matters relating to the mutual benefit and protection of those engaged in the bottling business.

### Fond du Lac, Wis., March 8.—Ev-

ery arriving train today has brought its quota of delegates or visitors to the annual state convention and athletic meet of the Young Men's Christian association. Oshkosh, Milwaukee, Appleton, Green Bay, La Crosse and other leading cities of the state will be well represented. Tomorrow and Saturday will be the big days of the athletic contests. The program consists of six events, open to all Y. M. C. A. athletes of the state.
