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### MARCONI WEDDED IN LONDON.

Couple Coming to America on Wedding Tour.

London, March 16.—In the Roman Catholic church of St. George, Miss Beatrice O'Brien, a lineal descendant of King Brian Boru of Ireland, today became the bride of Guglielmo Marconi, who enjoys a world-wide fame as a scientist, largely due to his remarkable discoveries in wireless telegraphy.

Signor Marconi and his bride have engaged passage to sail for America on Saturday. They will remain in the United States about six weeks and then will go to Rome, where, it is reported, they will be guests of the king of Italy for a few days.

The bride of today is a bright, comely girl, fond of outdoor sports, and also well read. She is one of the eight sisters of the present Baron Inchiquin. The Inchiquin family traces its descent direct from Brian Boru, who was king of the Emerald Isle from 1002 to 1014, when he was slain at the head of his army at the battle of Clontarf. His grandson, Turlogh, king of Munster, had four sons, whereof the third was the progenitor of the Barons Inchiquin. One of Turlogh's descendants, Connor O'Brien, was king of Thomond at no comparatively recent period as 1529, and it was his brother, Murrough who, after usurping his kingship, surrendered to Henry VIII and was then made earl of Thomond for life and given the Inchiquin barony.

Signor Marconi first made the acquaintance of Miss O'Brien a year ago when staying at Lord Dunraven's house, near Limerick.
