## FOR BETTER MORALS

ATHENA HAS ORGANIZED  
A CIVIC LEAGUE.

Law Loving People of the Farming Town Have Joined Together for Law Enforcement—Have Taken Courage From the Results in Pendleton—Sunday Closing of Saloons Will Be Strictly Enforced.

Athens, May 11.—(Special.)—Tired of the violations of the laws on Sunday closing and gambling, the citizens of this city have organized a Civic League, for the purpose of improving the morals of the town and ridding the community of the objectionable class.

Regular meetings of the league are held and the membership is increasing constantly. Many citizens who were averse to joining in the movement at first are now active members and it is thought that the saloons will be closed on Sunday, according to the state laws, in a short time.

The law loving people of this community have taken encouragement from the success of the movement started in Pendleton by the East Oregonian, which has resulted in the closing of gambling and the formation of a strong law enforcement league, in the county seat.

Farmers who have been worried very much in the past by drunkenness among hired men on Sundays, during the harvest season are enthusiastically joining the league and it is expected to take action to enforce the Sunday closing law.
