STATE BOARD MEETS

CUSTODIAN APPOINTED FOR STATE FAIR GROUNDS.

President Downing, of the Board, Will Make a Purchase of Useful and Much Needed Property at the Close of the Lewis and Clark Fair—State Fair for 1906 Will Be a Hummer.

Although called for the purpose of electing a farmer to take charge of the state fair grounds for the ensuing year only, the meeting of the state fair board yesterday afternoon turned out to be quite an important affair and bore good results, says the Salem Statesman.

A farmer was chosen in the person of Con Homyer, a well known, responsible and experienced man for the position, and he will assume his duties October 1. This position carries with it a salary of \$500 per annum and the duties consist of keeping the track in first-class condition and looking after the property on the grounds. He will also be permitted to raise crops on the tillable soil and receive one-third of the yield as compensation.

This duty performed the board spent the balance of the morning in general discussion of affairs pertaining to the improvement of the grounds and property generally and drifted into a prospective of the 1906 state fair.

As a result of this latter discussion it developed that the board will awaken to renewed energy and enterprise for the next state fair and endeavor to make it of such proportions and general excellence as to overshadow all previous exhibits in all departments and features.

New ideas were advanced along all lines of state fair work and the meeting promises to bear good fruit when the gates of the 1906 exhibition are thrown open to the public.

There is a small surplus in the improvement fund and President Downing was authorized by the board to negotiate with the management of the Lewis and Clark fair for the purchase of such property which will add to the attractiveness and benefit of the state fair grounds.

President Downing will leave for Portland this morning and will enter into negotiations with the fair management for the purchase of a number of iron settees, exhibit furniture and paraphernalia, statuary, etc., as his judgment dictates.

which will be for sale at the close of the Portland fair, which will be invaluable to the state fair management in the future, and especially in this so with respect to show cases, stands and seats.

At present there is no seating accommodations on the state fair grounds where one may rest during the day, and a few seats scattered about in the shade of the trees on the grounds would be greatly appreciated by the patrons of the annual events, and it is regarded as a piece of wise foresightedness on the part of the fair board to have taken these essential details into consideration.

President Downing says that he will also make an attempt to interest all of the counties having exhibits at the Lewis and Clark fair in the state fairs of the future and will endeavor to induce them to remove all of their exhibit paraphernalia to the state fair grounds, where it will be useful for the respective counties to make exhibits of their resources at the state exhibits in the future.

Through the enlargement of the space in the main pavilion ample room has been provided and President Downing says that he will have plenty of space next year to allow the merchants and business establishments of this and other cities of the state to advertise their business. Heretofore concession space has been at a premium and there has been a great demand for it, but he thinks he will now have enough space to satisfy the demand.
