WATER WHEEL A SUCCESS.

J. S. Mathews Has Completed All Details of an Irrigation Wheel and Will Place it on the Market.

J. S. Mathews, the veteran pump man and foreman in the service of the O. R. & N. has just completed an irri-gation wheel, which he will make an effort to place on the market. The East Oregonian gave a description of the wheel a year ago, but Mr. Mathews as improved it and is now certain of

The wheel consists of a tight drum, anchored under the water and revolv-ed by the current. The drum will either float on top of a stream or will work equally well under water. It is fitted with wings which open as the current strikes them, thus giving the wheel an extended surface for the water to

The wheel can be used in lifting water, generating electricity or in driving machinery and is one of the simplest
