RAILROAD BRANCH

IMPORTANT WORK OF A CHRISTIAN ORDER.

Nearly Two Thousand Members of the Railroad Y. M. C. A. Meet With Railroad Officials—The Order Is an International Organization and Almost a Protege of the Railroad Officials—Delegates Will Occupy Detroit Pulpit Next Sunday.

Detroit, Sept. 28.—Nearly two thousand members of the Railroad Branch of the Young Men's Christian Association and railroad officials from all parts of the country are assembled here to attend the biennial session or conference of the Y. M. C. A. Railroad Branch. It is by far the most important conference of that organization ever held and great results are expected from it. The organization is of an international character and delegates from railroads in Russia, Germany, England, France, Italy, Japan and other countries are in attendance.

Many foreign governments have taken great interest in the work of the Y. M. C. A. and have expressed their willingness to facilitate the work of the organization in every possible way. The same may be said of the managements of the American railroads, which not only countenance the efforts of the association, but give its members strong support in their work. So intimate are the relations between the managements of the railroads and the Y. M. C. A., that it is believed that the latter organization is destined to play an important part in the final arrangement of the relations between labor and capital, at least in this branch of industry.

The conference was opened this morning and the delegates were welcomed on behalf of the city by Mayor Codd. Responses were made by several prominent delegates from the United States and foreign countries. In the afternoon the delegates, railroad officials and distinguished visitors will take a trip to the Flats as the guests of the reception committee.

During the four days of the conference many of the delegates will address noonday shop meetings, pointing out to the shop men the good work that is done by the Y. M. C. A. On Sunday every pulpit in Detroit will be occupied by delegates to the conference, officials and railway employes. On Saturday evening a banquet will be given to which the railway officials and other guests will be invited.

Five Millions to Charity.

London, Sept. 28.—The will of Baron Nathaniel Rothschild, who died in Vienna recently, was admitted to probate here and has been accepted by all concerned. The Baron be-

queathed over \$5,000,000 to charity, chiefly devoted to the relief of sufferers from chronic and incurable diseases. He left \$454,375 to the charitable institutions of Vienna; \$9855 to the poor of Vienna without distinction of creed; \$10,000 to the poor fund of Schillersdorf; \$10,000 to the Charlot-tenstift at Hultschun; \$5000 for distribution among the poor of Schillersdorf, and \$4840 for the poor of Niesfeld. The will directs the executors to continue all pensions.

Want to Keep the Constitution.

Boston, Sept. 28.—Local members of the Daughters of the American Revolution, Daughters of 1812 and other patriotic organizations are determined to oppose every attempt to remove the old frigate Constitution from the Charlestown navy yard. They say that it would not only be out of place elsewhere than Boston, where it was built, but it would fall to pieces should any attempt be made to remove the old ship to any new quarters. It has been suggested to raise a fund among the school children of Brooklyn, N. Y., to purchase the old ship and bring it to Brooklyn, with a view to preserving it there as a nautical relic. This plan is bitterly opposed by the patriotic women of this city and a meeting has been called to consider the matter and decide upon some method of preserving the frigate, without removing it from its present quarters.

Banquet for Mayflower Descendants.

Poland Springs, Me., Sept. 28.—The Maine Society of Mayflower Descendants in the state of Maine, will be the guests of Hiram Rickler and sons at a banquet at the Poland Springs House tonight. The Rickler brothers and sisters are all members of the society, and take great interest in it. Several distinguished members of the society from New York and Massachusetts will be present and will address the banquet party.

Negroes on State Question.

Oskmukize, I. T., Sept. 28.—The Negro Suffrage League of Indian Territory met here today for the purpose of considering the statehood question and to give the colored voters of the territory an opportunity to express themselves on the subject. The attendance is very large and the sentiment in favor of statehood very enthusiastic.

Sanitorium a Success.

The success of Heppner sanitorium is assured. The institution has been established only six months and is now receiving patients as far away as Albany, this state.—Heppner Gazette.

New Electric Line Out of Boise.

Articles incorporating the Boise Valley Railway company, limited, were filed today with the secretary of state and county auditor of Ada county. The capital stock is fixed at \$1,000,000 and principal office is to be in Boise.

The object of the company is to build an electric line down the valley to Caldwell or some other point on the main line of the railroad, also to Emmett and several other points. This is the company promoted by Donaldson & Ustick, of this city.

The directors chosen for the first year are B. F. Olden, John McMillan, Robert Noble, A. Ross, H. E. Neal, D. R. Hubbard, W. N. Dolandson, O. V. Allen and H. P. Ustick, all of Boise.—Boise Capital News.

Donation Is "an Elephant."

By the terms of the will of the late Mrs. Sarah C. Thompson, recently filed with Probate Judge Hanlon, the Lewiston Presbyterian church is a beneficiary to the amount of \$16,000. The donation is most acceptable to the church, but one of its stipulations promises to be a weighty problem to solve.

It is a part of the compact that the money shall be utilized in erecting two church buildings in eastern and southeastern parts of the city on property heretofore donated by Mrs. Thompson, and it is further stated that these buildings shall be erected within the next five years or the money is to revert to the estate.

The facts are that the church is none too rich and has not a sufficient membership to maintain more than one church in the city. Nor would it be possible to move this church to either of the sites donated by Mrs. Thompson on account of their remoteness from the center of the city. The property donated has been in the possession of the church some time, but, instead of giving a revenue, has been an expense in the way of taxes and improvements. The impression being current that the church has ample funds for all needs has proven a great handicap to securing the actual money needed for running expenses, and with a stipulation that two new churches must be erected within the next five years under a penalty of forfeiting \$16,000, a new burden has been added.—Lewiston Tribune.

\$125,000 Hotel for Lewiston.

The Tribune learned yesterday that a movement is on foot to erect a hotel in Lewiston to cost, when completed, \$125,000. The building will be one of the finest in the state and will be used exclusively as a hotel. An architect has been employed and plans will be submitted in a few days. The size of the structure has not been definitely decided upon, but it will be at least four stories in height, and of the most modern material. Work on the building will be commenced within a reasonably brief time.—Lewiston Tribune.
