GENERAL NEWS

The Standard Oil company March 15 advanced the price of gasoline half a cent per gallon. Deodorized stove gasoline is now quoted at 12-1-2 cents per gallon, 74 to 76 degree gasoline 14-1-2 cents and varnish makers' and painters' naphtha 11-1-2 cents.

The fight between Battling Nelson and Terry McGovern, at Philadelphia, was declared a draw at the end of the sixth round, though Nelson got much the best of the contest. Neither man went off his feet. Many spectators declare the fight to be a fake.

The British ship Easler, a freighter, sailed from Conso for Halifax February 22 and has not been heard from since. The distance of the two places from each other is but 170 miles. It is supposed the ship foundered during the recent storm and went to the bottom with all on board.

About 20,000 people live in the crater of an extinct volcano, 30 miles from Kumamoto, Japan. They dwell in this pit-like town surrounded by a veritable wall 800 feet high. The inhabitants rarely make a journey into the outer world, and practically they form a little community all by themselves.

A strike has been reported from the Nome district by advices to Captain E. W. Johnson, on whose property the find was made, of a pay streak that runs from \$400 to \$800 to the pan and is stated to be one of the richest of the entire territory. The claim is known as No. 8 on Cooper gulch and is contiguous to the Portland branch property.

At Frankfort, Ind., Dr. Ellis Dixon, aged 32, called up Miss Bessie Buchanan, of Indianapolis, by telephone, and while talking with her suddenly said "Good-bye." Miss Buchanan heard a loud report, followed by a crashing fall. Dr. Dixon had shot himself through the head while standing at the telephone, and before hanging up the receiver.

NORTHWEST NEWS

The next republican state convention of Idaho will be held at Pocatello. Idaho Falls and Lewiston were the only real competitors for the honor.

Officials of the Great Northern railroad announce their purpose of expending this year more than \$6,000,000 for freight and passenger equipment and refrigerator cars.

At 5 a. m., March 14, the thermometer registered 21 degrees above zero. This was the lowest temperature by three degrees recorded at Tacoma at any time for eight years past.

The last of last year's hop crop, stored at Aurora, has been sold for 9 1-3 cents and shipped direct to London, England. The same buyers are negotiating for what is stored of last year's crop in the Yakima valley.

The north bank railroad has placed orders for 100,000 barrels of cement, and one contractor on the Klamath project wants 10,000 barrels the coming summer. A general shortage of the product is reported all over the United States.

Eighty-five Greek laborers on the Southern Pacific, near Eugene, went on strike because of a grievance against the foreman. After being off duty two days they were placated by the appointment of a new foreman, and returned to work.

There are 1330 patients in the two insane asylums of Washington, of whom 469 are women. In all the state institutions of Washington—deaf and dumb school, school for feeble-

minded, penitentiary, insane asylums and reform school, are 2906 charges.

The academy board of the Annapolis Naval academy has consented to the resignation of 13 midshipmen, including Joseph L. Hoover, of Washington. Having deficient scholarship and various breaks of discipline and conduct would have led to court-martials had they not consented to leave the institution by an easier route.

ON GRAZING LANDS

PUBLIC LAND COMMISSIONER ISSUES REPORT.

Oregon Stockmen to the Number of 88 Answer Questions as to Condition and Treatment—Over 1100 Replies From 1400 Letters Sent Out by the Commission.

Oregon stockmen to the number of 88 have written personal letters to the public land commission appointed by the president some time ago to investigate public land and range conditions.

The commission sent out 1400 letters to western stockmen and received in reply about 1100 personal letters, all written with care and giving detailed answers to questions asked by the commission. In these 1100 replies the commission has secured a fair expression of public sentiment on the matter of leasing range to private owners and will act accordingly.

The questions asked in the letter of commission were in regard to the best method of handling the public range, causes of the deterioration of the range, best method of the revolving run down ranges and the best method of insuring a permanent supply of grass on the range areas of the west.

The East Oregonian has just received from Senator Gearin a copy of the report of the public land commission on range leasing, giving detailed facts of the progress of the work of the commission. This report can be secured by writing to either Senators Fulton or Gearin at Washington, and is a valuable study for stockmen who are interested in the subject of ranges and public lands. The report is accompanied by colored maps showing the relative area of range and tillable lands in the western states and is a valuable addition to the library of the stockmen.

In answer to the question, "Has the range improved or deteriorated in Oregon recently?" 68 Oregon stockmen answered "deteriorated," and 20 answered "improved."

In answer to the question, "What, in your opinion, is the most practical method for the proper control and permanent improvement of the public range in Oregon?" 35 Oregon stockmen answered "individual pastures," 22 answered "community division of ranges," one answered "the development of water," 12 answered "sell the grazing lands," four answered "irrigation and cultivation" and one answered "limit the grazing season."

In answer to the question, "If range has been diminished, has it been due to overstocking or to the manner of handling stock?" 53 answered "overstocking," five "drought," 17 "excessive sheep grazing," 16 answered "methods of handling stock," five answered "premature grazing," and five "settlement."

In answer to the question, "Do you favor government control of the ranges under reasonable regulations?" 81 Oregon stockmen answered "yes," four answered "no," and three left the question unanswered.

The report deals at length with the forest reserve policy of the government as a means of improving ranges by limiting the number of stock on certain areas and by preventing premature grazing by fixing the date of admission of stock late enough in the spring to insure no damage to growing and tender grass.

Irrigation is also treated as a factor in range improvement and betterment by furnishing winter feed for stockmen, thus preventing heavy winter grazing on land that is overstocked during the summer season.

The East Oregonian urges all stockmen to send for the report. Its official title is "Grazing Lands," and either of the Oregon senators will send a copy on request.

TO PREACH IN MEXICO.

Baker City Minister Assigned to Larger Field.

In recognition of 11 years of highly successful work in the pastorate of the Methodist Episcopal church the foreign missions board of that church has selected Rev. E. M. Hill, of this city, for one of the best fields within its province, the American Methodist Episcopal church of the City of Mexico, says the Baker City Herald.

Rev. Hill will leave Baker City for Mexico some time in the early part of April. It is with profound regret that the congregation of his church here sees their pastor depart for his new field, but one and all are glad for his sake that he has received the call to the great field of Mexico City.

Since Rev. Hill has been a pastor of the M. E. church he has accomplished a great many things for the church. In the different pastorates which he has filled his work has met with marked success. The accomplishment which now confronts Rev. Hill is the erection of the finest protestant church in the City of Mexico. This task has been set Rev. Hill by the mission board.

RESOURCEFUL ARIZONA.

The Far West Territory Rich in Forests, Minerals and Fertile Soil.

Arizona has the largest and most valuable forest in the United States—probably the largest unbroken forest area in the world, covering 10,000 square miles, says S. M. Hall, in Out West. She has the largest tract of agricultural land west of Kansas, and with the completion of the Tonto reservoir (the largest artificial lake in the world), will have under cultivation, with ample water, as much land as is farmed in all southern California from the Tehachepi to San Diego. The investigations of the government reclamation service have shown that, in spite of the tradition of her impenetrable mountains and barren deserts, nearly one-half the land in

Arizona is capable of cultivation, and with water would be immensely productive.

Various water storage projects will, in time, create rich and valuable farming districts in regions now given over almost wholly to grazing or mining; but the utmost now projected will leave great areas still unclaimed—and to be reclaimed only by some means now unforeseen, as, in the beautiful valley below the town of Naco on the El Paso & Southwestern railroad, a constantly enlarging tract is irrigated with the water that is pumped from a mine some miles distant, and the resulting farm is one of the finest in the territory.

The underflow water of Arizona is practically unknown and undeveloped, and it may be hoped, will play no small part in the agricultural development of the future.
