

# Among the Exchanges of the Inland Empire

**Shot Into a Box of Powder.**  
The residents of Pierce were startled Tuesday evening by a terrific explosion, and for a few moments were at a loss to know what had happened. Investigation showed that a part of a box of giant powder had been thrown in the dump at the north end of Main street and George Gaffney, unaware of what the box contained, shot into it. The effect was immediate, the report of the gun being entirely drowned by the explosion that followed. Buildings were shaken and in those nearest the spot window glass was shattered. For several seconds after the report earth, sticks, bones and pebbles were falling in the street.

Fortunately the box of explosives lay on the side and near the foot of a solid bank and was but partially covered with old debris so that the force was away from a number of boys who stood within a few feet of the brink of the bank, otherwise the story we have to relate would be a sad one. How the powder came there is a mystery, the general supposition being that it was a part of a lot someone supposed to be spoiled and dumped it out—Pierce Miner.

**Dr. Gritman Bound Over.**  
Dr. C. L. Gritman, who is charged with criminal assault, was today bound over to appear before the next session of the district court under bonds of \$5000 at the hearing which was concluded here today. Dr. Gritman is accused by Miss Verne McHardy, the 16-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John McHardy. His bondsmen are Fred Veatch, M. J. Shields, E. N. Brown and G. A. Rubedew.

The testimony was resumed this morning with Miss McHardy on the stand. One of the important features of her testimony was the contradiction of some of the statements made yesterday relative to her condition at the time of the alleged assault. The defense introduced no testimony, this being taken as evidence that Gritman's attorneys did not want to disclose their line of defense. The only other witness to be examined was John McHardy, the father of the girl.—Moscow Mirror.

**Dairy Herd of Sixty Cows.**  
Manager Sawyer of the Pierce farm, formerly known as the Wade farm, has purchased the Peach Bros' herd of Jersey dairy cows, and will take them to the farm near Hot Lake. With the cows now on the farm this will make a combined herd of 60 cows, the largest individual herd in Union county. Mr. Sawyer expects to continue to enlarge his herd until it reaches 100 head. Mr. Sawyer has arranged to sell his cream to the Blue Mountain Creamery company of this city, and has ordered a large De Laval cream separator and expects to be ready to furnish butter fat by the last of next week. Union county is fast becoming one of the foremost dairy counties in the state, and the end is not yet. The amount paid for this herd is said to be \$40 per head.—La Grande Observer.

**Need Help in the Orchards.**  
"The fruit crop is now ripening rapidly," said Ben Kelly this morning, "and there is a big demand for packers to handle the crop. I could use from 10 to 15 girls from now until the end of the season, but I find that such help is scarce. I am in Lewiston today to see if I cannot secure a force to take care of my pears and plums that are ready for the market. We will ship a mixed car Saturday billed to Duluth and shipments will be steady now until the end of the season in October."—Lewiston Teller.

**Died by Fractured Skull.**  
John W. Killian, a quarryman in the employ of the Jellison Bros., met with a peculiar accident which caused his death shortly before 5 o'clock last night.

Mr. Killian has been driving to and from the quarry in a small road cart, and was in the act of hauling his cart down the road past a large rock weighing nearly 1000 tons, under which a heavy charge had been set off nearly an hour before. The rock was slowly sinking and he wanted to get his cart past before the road was blocked by the huge boulder. He had just passed a few feet when the rock fell striking a smaller rock, from which a piece flew about the size of a man's fist, striking Killian on the left side of the head fracturing his skull.

Several physicians were summoned and the injured man was removed to St. Luke's hospital, where he underwent an operation for the removal of a small piece of bone that had entered the brain. He sank rapidly and died about 1 o'clock this morning.—Boise Capital News.

**Electric Line Into Benton (?).**  
The incorporation of the Spokane & Yakima railway this week has brought to light another scheme for the development of the country lying in east Moxee and in the White Bluffs country. It is understood that the scheme of this company is to build an electric line from Spokane to White Bluffs, cross the Columbia into Benton, follow the Columbia to the Yakima county line and then come down through the Moxee valley to this city. While this is a feasible project the proposition does not strike the average Yakima person as being possible of realization in the near future.—Yakima Republic.

**Fell and Broke Spinal Column.**  
A. J. Garcia, a waiter at the California restaurant, fell from the balcony of the restaurant building to the ground, a distance of 12 feet, last night and received injuries which will in all probability prove fatal, striking squarely on his head fracturing the spinal column between the shoulder blades.

Garcia was intoxicated and had fallen asleep against a guywire of a telephone pole, and evidently made some movement through which he lost balance and went over the balcony. The accident occurred about 9 o'clock in the evening.—The Dalles Chronicle.
