### NORTHWEST NEWS.

Rainier is to have a first-class hospital, to cost \$15,000.

The recent floods in King county, Wash., have caused damage to property amounting to about \$1,000,000.

William King, son of prominent Salem parents, has confessed at Lewiston to the theft of \$700 worth of jewelry stolen from guests of a hotel.

After squandering \$10,000 which he had dug out of the Nome gold fields, J. N. McLeod committed suicide in Portland by taking two ounces of carbolic acid.

"Peck" Bennett is under arrest at Dayton, Wash., charged with the crime of rape. He has been released under \$500 bonds to appear at the next term of superior court.

Two hundred feet of the Northern Pacific tunnel through the Cascade mountains has fallen as a result of the recent floods. Railroad traffic on this road will be tied up for several days.

The highest price paid for "stumpage" thus far recorded in the region tributary to the lower Columbia river, which is \$6 per 1000. Heretofore \$2 to \$2.50 was considered a top price for loggers at the stump.

Arthur McCoy, who shot and killed Herbert Foster, manager of Eckhardt's Ideal, a show company which appeared in Pendleton last week, has been found guilty of murder in the second degree, at Halley, Idaho.

## TRAVEL WAS HEAVY

### OREGON IMMIGRATION HAS BROKEN THE RECORD.

Two Thousand More People Came Into the State During the Past Year Than During the Year Preceding, Which in Turn Beat Its Predecessor One Thousand and Forty-Two—The Prospects for Next Year Are Regarded as Better Than for Any Preceding Year.

While the year of 1905 proved to be a record breaker for colonist travel to Oregon, this year has exceeded all former business, the immigration into the state surpassing that of last year by about 2000 persons. The total number of tickets sold to points west of Huntington was 9014, while last year it was 7972, an increase of 1042. It is estimated that about as many home-seekers arrived in Oregon over the Southern Pacific and Northern Pacific, making the total increase about 2000.

Statistics gathered at important points on the Harriman system showed Portland received 2213 colonists, against 2315 for 1905, but Spokane received \$31, as compared with 678 last year. The railroad officials feel gratified that the travel tended more to the smaller towns, as they argue the fact illustrates that the class of travel was desirable, and was made up mostly of persons desiring to settle in agricultural communities, and were not in search of employment.

The total to local stations on the O. R. & N. was 1511, as compared with 1437 in 1905. North of Portland it was 2824, while but 2279 during the preceding period. To the south the travel was represented by 1048 tickets sold, against 974 in 1905. North of Spokane it was 587, while in 1905 it was but 282.

Hood River secured 85 persons, against 25 in 1905. La Grande, 101, against 79; Baker City, 182, as compared with 144; Walla Walla, 227, with but 153, in 1905, and Pendleton received the same for the two years, 99 persons.

The sales will be on again during March and April, and in September and October, 1907, and from the encouraging increase made this season it is hoped to add largely to the totals next year. The demand for laborers at San Francisco because of the general building activity is thought to have attracted many customers who would otherwise have journeyed north to embark in agriculture or small business pursuits.

### WALLA WALLA WATER PROBLEM

City Will Buy Land for a Reservoir Site.

The latest developments of the problem of securing adequate supply of water for Walla Walla and properly storing it, are outlined as follows by the Statesman:

J. G. Thomas, whose offer to sell the city 80 acres of land for a reservoir site for \$19,000, was accepted by the council at its last meeting, submitted another proposition this morning in which he offers to sell the city 20 acres of land and deed a right of way for an overflow pipe to Mill creek for \$5000.

The offer was practically accepted at a meeting of the council as a committee of the whole, held in the city clerk's office this morning. One condition of the sale is, that the city will relinquish all rights to the subterranean water on the Thomas ranch which was acquired by the city some years ago at a cost of \$10,000.

Members of the council denied that the storm of protest which went up from certain quarters, when it became public that the council had decided to buy the 80 acres, had anything to do with Mr. Thomas submitting a new proposition, or with the council deciding to buy a less number of acres for the site.

The subterranean rights claimed have been a cloud on the Thomas ranch for many years, inasmuch as the city had the right to prospect and dig for water on any part of the ranch, which has had a tendency to keep the land off the market.

"I felt that 15 acres would be ample for the city's needs, but Engineer Thomson, who is in the city today, contends that 20 acres is not too much and Mr. Thomas' offer to sell 20 acres for \$5000 will probably be accepted. In addition to the 20 acres the city gets a 16-foot right of way for the overflow pipes to Mill creek," said Councilman Bridges.

### As to the New Gravity System.

Unless the most rigid economy is practiced in the expenditure of funds remaining in the water supply fund, the \$250,000 voted to construct Walla Walla's new gravity water system will not be sufficient to complete the work.

Inquiry at the city treasurer's office reveals the fact that out of the \$250,000 bond issue, \$179,510 has already been expended.

On Wednesday night, November 28, a game of basketball will be played in this city between the Weston Normal school team and a squad representing the Commercial association. This will be the first big game here of the season and considerable interest is being taken in the coming contest. Instructor Shockley is getting his men in trim for the event, and he states that he has excellent material to make a speedy team. The Weston players are also considered swift, and the predictions are that a fast and exciting game will be played.

The proceeds of the game will be used in defraying the expenses of the visitors and the balance will be given to the gymnasium fund. It is expected that a large crowd will be in attendance.

The commissioners will have men at work as soon as possible repairing the damages, and while some of the main traveled routes may be closed for a week or 10 days, it is thought that by the first of next week people in all the valleys will be able to get to town unless there is more rain.—Yakima Republic.

### Interest in Revival Meetings.

The revival services being conducted at the First Christian church by the pastor, Rev. Victor Dorris, are being well attended and great interest is being taken each night. The meetings began Monday night and will be held possibly for two weeks. Rev. Dorris is considered an evangelist of unusual ability, having done evangelistic work for a number of years. Strong sermons are being preached every night. Excellent singing by a well trained choir is also a feature of the meetings.

### Flood Losses in Yakima Valley.

Following are the estimates of losses of the various interests in the Yakima valley by the flood of last week: Northern Pacific, \$100,000; North Yakima & Valley railway, \$50,000; Northwest Light & Water company, \$50,000; Cascade Lumber company, \$30,000; Yakima county, loss of bridges, \$15,000; Kittitas county, loss of bridges, \$10,000; individuals, \$10,000; canal companies, \$20,000; total, \$285,000.—Yakima Republic.
