Among the Exchanges of the Inland Empire

N. P. Lands in Three Counties.

The Northern Pacific railroad since the 13th of July of last year has filed government patents for 75,187 acres of land in Morrow, Umatilla and Gilliam counties.

The land is covered by three patents which are now on record in the office of the county clerk.

The first patent for 32,575 acres was filed on the 13th of July of last year.

On September 10 of the same year a patent was filed for 1852 acres.

The last patent covering 40,760 acres was made a matter of record on January 26 of this year.

About 50,000 acres of this land is in Morrow county.

Assessor Connor has been engaged this week in determining the exact number of acres in this county for assessment.—Heppner Gazette.

Elgin Branch Blocked by Slide.

The Elgin track is keeping up with the customs of the times. While slides and washouts have crippled traffic east and west, during the past week, the branch between here and Elgin made its daily runs. But yesterday traffic was blocked even on this little 15 miles of road. For several days the cut immediately on the south side of the John Halgarth farm has been threatening to slide, and yesterday the rocks and dirt came down. This morning the work train was still trying to clear the track and the regular No. 62 was held at La Grande pending the clearance.

About 2 o'clock this afternoon the tracks had again been cleared. The Elgin branch left for Elgin shortly afterwards.—La Grande Observer.

Soldiers Discipline Soldiers.

Soldiers from the post who are in the habit of disturbing the peace in the city by getting full and falling into the hands of the police are to be dealt with in a new manner at the post. If a soldier gets drunk and the authorities learn of the fact, the troop to which he belongs is not permitted to leave the grounds for a week. At the end of that time the disorderly one is turned over to the troop and they may punish him as they see fit. This measure seems rather strenuous but it is believed it will have the desired effect.—Boise Capital News.
