Among the Exchanges of the Inland Empire. Stock Allowances on Two Reserves. The secretary of agriculture has authorized Howard O'Brien, ranger in charge to permit 150,000 grown sheep and 21,000 horses and cattle on the Wallowa reserve, and 50,000 sheep and 12,000 horses and cattle on the Cheminnus reserve. Lambs will not be charged for this year on either reserve. The rates charged on the Wallowa reserve will be 7 cents per head for grown sheep from July 1 to October 15; for cattle, 20 to 25 cents, and for horses, 40 to 50 cents for the same period. The one-half rate limit on less than 70 head will not be allowed this year. It was given last year owing to the low price of cattle. On the Cheminnus the rate will be 7 1/2 cents per head for sheep from June 15 to October 25, or 2 cents per month up to three months, with an additional cent and one-half per month thereafter up to eight months, or 14 cents per head for any period from eight months to one year. No permit will be granted for less than three months. The rates for cattle and horses will be the same as on the Wallowa reserve.—Wallowa Sun. Eastern Oregon Final Survey. The final location for the Eastern Oregon railroad, Harriman's proposed line across central Oregon from Natron to Ontario, has been completed and it is expected construction will begin within 90 days. The route surveyed is 240 miles long. Starting at Natron the survey runs along the middle fork of the Willamette to Salt creek, thence along that stream through the Cascades by way of Odell pass, thence through Christinas Lake valley, where 750,000 acres of agricultural lands are awaiting settlement, thence south of Wagon Tine mountain through the center of Harney valley, thence down the Malheur river to Ontario, connecting with the Oregon Short Line. Locating engineers and surveyors have been in the field 15 months perfecting surveys for this line.—Boise Capital News. Court Episodes at La Grande. The jury in the case of the State vs. Fred Ryner, charged with robbing one Fagin, of some \$80, returned a verdict this morning of guilty as charged. Ryner was a bartender at the Owl saloon and was charged with relieving Fagin of this amount while the sal Fagin was under the influence of a combination of small beers. This case has occupied the attention of the circuit court for the past two days and went to the jury last evening at 8:30. The first ballot
