WASHINGTON FARMERS FORM MUTUAL COMPANY.

Company Will Be Confined Strictly to Counties-Will Insure Grain Growing, in Stacks, in Sacks and in Warehouses at One-Half the Price Charged by the Old Line Companies.

Umatilla farmers will be interested a mutual farm insurance company seing formed by farmers in eastern A dispatch from Pull-Washington. man says of the subject:

The sub-committee appointed by President E. A. Bryan, of the Washington state college who was author-ized to do so by the Wheatgrowers' ssociation of Washington, has outlined a plan for a farmers' mutual insurance company, says a Pullman dispatch.

In substance the committee report

vill be as follows: The company shall be limited to each county, and the maximum insur-ance shall be \$1000 on each quarter section of land. The minimum assess-ment will not be lower than one-half old line company rates; payments of the assessment shall be required in advance. The surplus, should any accrue, is to be carried over through he years when losses are slight, and applied to policies when the losses ex-

eed the assessment. The policies are to cover losses of grain sacks when on the land, growing in the stacks, or in granaries in the field. This excludes anything then in the warehouse. Risks will be classified according to exposure; that is, proximity to non-insured grain, and to railroads. The policy fee, in addion to the prescribed assessment, will Class A., which will be considered the basis in making rates, consists of grain not exposed on any


